Words from Steve

Being Present In Christ Is Our Collective Calling

On the Tuesday night of camp I was asked to lead worship for the camp counselors. While adult volunteers watched over the campers, I gathered with the nearly twenty camp counselors under a pavilion, under a starlit sky, with lighting bugs flitting about to hear the word, eat His meal, and sing. At the halfway point of summer camp, this was their first time to worship together as a community.

As a pastor, I don't always get the opportunity to address such a specific demographic as this. What do you say to twenty, sub twenty year old's at a faith based outdoor adventure camp? What do they need to hear? What will fill their cup for the next four weeks of camp before heading back to college, or the next step of adulting, and beginning a career? So, I reflected on what I'd seen the first two days of camp, and asked the Spirit to give me a text and message. This is what I saw...

Weaved in and out of the outdoor adventure activities at camp are times of camp counselor led prayer, song, worship, and bible study. Camp counselors are always "on". For five days in a row, they are the go to persons for the camp kids. Each counselor tends to every need of a camper over the course of their camp week. Food, water, shelter, safety, emotional, physical and spiritual support of their campers is their number one priority. It is exhausting work. Especially exhausting when there are campers who need extra attention because they are out of their element; kids who are not accustomed to outdoor adventure activities, or being away from home.

Under McKnight Pavilion on the south slope of Sugar Mountain in Newland North Carolina at Camp Lutherock, I began by asking them the question, "Why are you here?" It's not for money. They make less than \$2 an hour. It's not because it's easy. It is not because the food is great. It is not because the beds are comfy, and they get to bathe three times a day. Not at all. They are here because they have been called to be camp counselors. It is not a job, it is a call from God to serve God's people (campers) in the love of Jesus. That was the framework to the reminder of why they are here.

I went on to share how I had seen them serve the kids. The group encouragement, as well as their individual asides. I saw the side hugs and high fives. I saw the one on one with the child in tears. I

saw the efforts to help a child connect with their inner strength. I witnessed them reaching out to the kid on the sideline. And thus, I saw Jesus at work. And, that I knew the Spirit of the Risen Christ was working through them with the kids when there were no eyewitnesses. Being that present and attentive to the needs of others is tiresome. Even Jesus had to take breaks, and recenter himself. He was just as much human as he was divine. In order for Jesus to be fully present, he too had to take breaks.

Somewhere along the line of life, I heard someone say, "Wherever you are, be there." In other words, be present. The ministry of simply being present is powerful. So powerful, that the Spirit continues to work after we have been there and done whatever good we were led to do. Consider Jesus' encounter with the disciples on the walk to Emmaus.

The disciples are walking away from Jerusalem towards Emmaus. Jesus comes alongside them. They don't recognize him. They lament his death, and their future. Then "As they came near the village to which they were going, he walked ahead as if he were going on. ²⁹But they urged him strongly, saying, 'Stay with us, because it is almost evening and the day is now nearly over.' So he went in to stay with them. ³⁰When he was at the table with them, he took bread, blessed and broke it, and gave it to them. ³¹Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight. ³²They said to each other, 'Were not our hearts burning within us while he was talking to us on the road, while he was opening the scriptures to us?' (Luke 24:28-32).

Jesus was moving on, but when asked to stay with them he did. Jesus remained present, even though it appears his walk with them had come to an end. It was at supper, that their faith was jogged, and who he was while on the road came to light. Sometimes, the presence of our Lord is experienced after the fact. And that is ok. In fact, it might just be all a part of God's plan.

Pastor Emily Harkens of The Dwelling in Winston Salem shared this in a recent message of hers I heard, "We are how we treat each other, nothing more." My hope and prayer message for the camp counselors and for you good person reading this, is that you do what you need to do so that the Lord may be made present for you. Ask him to stay with you, and know that he will. And because he stays with you, stay with one another. Through the joys and the pains stay with one another. Be present with one another. Be attentive to one another, for your God is attentive to you. May we treat each other with the gift of increased time and presence, because of the One who's time and presence is eternal. Amen.

God calls us to be truly present for one another. Begin being more present today by finishing the prompts below, and praying over them.


