Words From Steve

Perspective Leads to Prayer

Sunday June 1st is a day in the life of Nativity I will not soon forget. I tell it to you as I experienced it, because I don't want you to forget it either. First, we officially received twenty-seven persons across nine families into Nativity membership during worship (see pic in this issue). Second, it was the unofficial unveiling of the 95% completed/newly remodeled Family Room space.

A few minutes before worship, as the sky grew gray with clouds, a new coffee table was carried through the front door and made its home in front of the big comfy couch. Someone asked if there was going to be a clock above the big comfy couch. Another replied, "yes, right where the paper taped to the wall says clock. And they laughed.

People took turns sitting on the big comfy couch. It didn't take long before there were feet propped up on the new coffee table. Comfortable. Kids were moving too swiftly about those whose days of moving swiftly are in the past. Careful.

During renovations of the kitchen a handwritten sign that reads Children — No Donuts Before Sunday School was rediscovered when the old cabinetry was torn out. It's message is as relevant and necessary as the Gospel of Jesus Christ! It is now framed above the big comfy couch. A mom and daughter charter member remarked to me, "That was when I was a kid here." Nostalgic.

In the kitchen the ladies prepped for a busier than usual coffee hour because of the new member reception. I'm asked, "where's the Styrofoam cups?"- "I don't know." Someone speaks up and reminds us where they have gone to rest. "Oh yeah", I think. So, at the outset of worship there was an announcement that we will us Nativity mugs for worship and a declaration that we will not be using environmentally unkind Styrofoam cups anymore. So we used Nativity mugs, and did more dishes. God's work. Our hands.

During worship the grey sky lets loose. It's pouring. During my sermon I hear the water dripping onto the terrazzo a few feet in front of me. Out of the corner of my eye I see the pianist makes adjustments because the roof is leaking right over the baby grand. As I press on with the Lord's word surrounding the baptism of Paul and Silas' jailer in the book of Acts, two men sop up the wet floor and place buckets. Through the open sanctuary doors I could see people scurrying about sopping and bucketing as well. Meanwhile the thunder and lightning raged on, and divinely enough, seemed to ebb and flow with the rest of the service. IYKYK. You had to be there.

After worship there were first timers to the kitchen making the much needed second pot of coffee. I was asked for the key to the shed so someone could go outside and make sure the parking lot storm drain was free of tree debris. Did I mention that the new kitchen sink refused to drain? I entered in and out of conversations far quicker than I like to, and didn't have the ones I wanted, or needed to have. Sigh. The big comfy couch was moved away from the wall because rain was running down the wall, making the big comfy couch, not so comfy.

Aluminum pans and plastic table cloths came to the rescue! After Sunday School children were first

in line for bagels, sweet cakes and fruit. There were no donuts today. Older kids gathered in the breezeway and talked about Camp Lutherock.

On Sunday June 1st, more people than usual were in the Family Room. People were sitting where they don't usually sit, were standing were they don't usually stand, and doing what they don't usually do on Sundays at Nativity. Water invaded spaces where it was not supposed to be (leaks), did not go where it was supposed to go (kitchen drain), and then again, did go where it was supposed to go (storm drain). I cannot help but wonder how "normal" the day would have seemed, had it not been for water?

It took me until Monday June 2nd to see Sunday June 1st as being a perfect storm of events. It took a conversation or two on this morning, and the urging of the Holy Spirit to see Sunday June 1st for what it was. Weaved in-between the unwanted and wanted waters was and abundance of life. The past, present and a glimpse of the future of Nativity was before our eyes. Did you see it? I almost missed it. I'm glad I didn't.

Pray this out loud...Lord God have your Holy Spirit move my heart and mind to perceive the good changes arriving at Nativity. Have your Spirit move my heart and mind to go with flow of new life at Nativity. Make me live into my baptism, that what is good for the body of Christ is good for me as well. Guide me, protect me, and enable me to live for Jesus. Amen.

Eight youth and their parents are headed to Camp Lutherock in North Carolina. While the kids are engaged in camp activities, the parents and Pastor Steve will be building community, and strengthening relationships amongst ourselves. Attending camp is part of our youth's confirmation program. Over the course of the next few weeks the youth will be leading a couple fundraising efforts to offset the cost of camp.
