A Faith That Works

A five week sermon series for the month of September in the book of James shows us how to live our faith in action.

The book of James stands unique in the New Testament for is no-nonsense, practical, proverbial wisdom. There is very little cryptic language or mysterious imagery in the way that it calls people to live out their discipleship. For James, faith is neither radically privatized nor solely personal. It is to be expressed outwardly, to improve one's relationships with others and to help those in need. This series challenges the belief that faith is something that should be kept to one's self and challenges our modern day culture that questions the value in religion at all.

Martin Luther was not a fan of the book of James, calling it, "an epistle of straw". He believed it's grace was not sturdy enough to be included in the canon. He insisted that James relied too heavily on the works of an individual as their saving grace, and not faith in God alone. Wherein Mark (the Gospel that accompanies James) has claims that sin comes from within: James says it comes from the outside world, which Christians need to avoid. Churches have taught that both are true. Whereas other books of the Bible are informative (the head) or emotive (the heart), James is uniquely practical in that its imagery is solid and tangible; hands working for the good of God's kingdom, or feet moving in the direction of someone who needs assistance. James will challenge us to live out our faith, making a difference, and offering our whole self to God.

Friends & Feelings

This month, your child will learn new ways to make friends, talk to friends, be respectful of differences and express their feelings. Watch for exciting art to come home throughout the week. Take time to ask why and how your child made the

projects. Your child will also bring home games and books. Play and read together. The month is full of discovery, communication and friendship.

Each month, your child will be creating art, participating in classroom projects and sharing what they learned. Watch for exciting activities to come home and use them as communication tools to talk to your child about what they are learning.

Try asking these questions to learn more about your child's experiences:

- 1. Can you show me your favorite part of this project?
- How did you make it?
- 3. Who else made a similar project? What else did you do with that friend?

It is often difficult for children to find the words to express their ideas or feelings. Use movement or visual aids to help your child show you their choices or feelings. Use this minitheme poster and ask your child to point to the way they felt during different parts of their day. Ask, "How did you feel during circle time? Snack time? Nap time?"

Five Strategies for Individualized Learning

In our daily routine we focus on five ways to individualize learning and address the wide range of skills and abilities children demonstrate throughout the day.

- 1. Offer many choices. We encourage children to participate and explore in the way they prefer.
- 2. Plan for possibilities. We think about how we can adjust the activity in the moment for children who need more time, more support, or experience with concrete materials to understand the concept.
- 3. Empower children to document their learning. We talk to children about how and why we take notes, photos, or videos of their work. We invite children to share what they would like to do or are doing, through art and stories and even writing.
- 4. Encourage community support. We celebrate each child's expertise and encourage all within the community to support children who could benefit from their help.
- 5. **Provide a variety of learning materials.** In your physical classroom and outdoors, we evaluate the materials in each interest area. Are there puzzles for children with different ability levels? Books about topics that interest the children, and relate to their lives?

Start Early and Don't Miss a Day!

One of the first signs of your baby's emergent literacy development is when they seem to understand what you are saying. And really, from the moment your baby begins to coo or babble, they are communicating. Remarkably, a baby's brain possesses boundless potential; its capacity for storage is limitless. So, the more varied and enriching experiences and conversations you provide your baby, the more their brain expands and advances. Early literacy includes the development of language, listening, speaking, viewing, reading and writing.

Here are a few more ways to inspire your child's early literacy development:

Infants

- Engage in conversation with your baby throughout the day by having conversations with them while describing what you are doing.
- Sing songs and read nursery rhymes to your baby.

Toddlers

- Provide opportunities for your toddler to write by scribbling on a large piece of paper with a jumbo or large crayon. Ask your toddler "Can you tell me about the picture you drew?" or "What did you draw or write?" Next, draw a picture of a dog on your toddler's paper. If your toddler tells you it is a dog, write the word "dog." This supports their emergent literacy skills.
- Sing the song "I'm a Little Tea Pot" with your toddler. Encourage your toddler to learn to sing and move with each action in the song.

Preschoolers

- While you're driving or riding on public transit, sing, read signs and talk about the words you see in the
 environment, such as store and street signs. Ask your child, "Do you see the letters in the words on the
 sign?" This provides a fantastic way to expose your child to the alphabet and words.
- Read a book for 15 to 20 minutes with your child every day. This helps them learn to listen and builds their vocabulary.

You can also use the following resources to support engaging with your child:

- The Division of Early Learning's <u>Florida Early Learning and Developmental Standards</u> (FELDS) provide information on the progression of learning and development from birth to age five. The Language and Literacy domain has suggested activities that encourage your child's communication and early literacy development. You can also talk with your child's teacher about activities to do at home to support skills they are currently learning in the classroom.
- Florida Commissioner of Education Manny Diaz, Jr.'s <u>Commissioner's Book of the Month</u> promotes literacy and reading engagement while helping children succeed academically and in life through a monthly reading challenge.

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PARENTS' PAGES

Screening and Progress Monitoring

Developmental screening and progress monitoring help show how children develop and progress in their growth and educational development. When conducted regularly, both offer valuable insights into a child's progress over time.

Children from birth to age 5 who participate in the School Readiness (SR) program undergo annual developmental screenings. Parents complete an electronic Ages & Stages Questionnaire (ASQ) on each child when completing the enrollment process. Screenings identify whether children are meeting milestones appropriate for their age or whether they may need targeted assistance. To learn more about the ASQ, contact your local early learning coalition.

Children in Florida's Voluntary Prekindergarten (VPK) program participate in the Florida Assessment of Student Thinking (FAST) or FAST Star Early Literacy. This ongoing progress monitoring helps teachers understand children's educational needs as the teachers monitor children's learning progression throughout VPK.

Child Care Resource and Referral (CCR&R) is a free program that connects families living in or moving to Florida with community resources.

Child Care Resource and Referral:

- Informs families on how to identify quality child care environments.
- Helps families with the School Readiness and Voluntary Prekindergarten application process.
- Educates families about a child's basic needs, financial assistance options, community resources and agencies that support family well-being.
- Connects families to specialists and resources for supporting children with special needs.
- Shares resources that support the needs of military families.

How do I receive CCR&R assistance?

Contact your local <u>early learning coalition</u> and speak to a CCR&R specialist. You may also call the state office on their toll-free family line at 866-357-3239.

To celebrate, help your child show their appreciation and love with heartfelt gestures. Have them draw a picture, create a card or make a phone call or video chat. If the grandparents live nearby, plan a visit or maybe even a picnic. Grandparents cherish acknowledgment from their grandchildren.

Encourage grandparents interested in volunteering in the classroom to contact the school or talk to your child's classroom teacher to learn about ways they can assist during the school day. Volunteer opportunities can include support during small group, at recess or even reading a story to the class. Grandparents bring unique and enriching perspectives, love and wisdom.

Mark your calendar. National Grandparents Day is a great opportunity to honor the positive role grandparents play in the lives of grandchildren.

My Journey to Wartburg

My journey to Wartburg began in April 2021, during a period of personal discernment following my wife's passing. My pastor in Florida encouraged me to consider exploring new paths. After discussions about my calling and potential seminary options, my pastor, Steve Winsor, a Wartburg alumnus, recommended Wartburg based on my desire for community involvement. After conversations with the admissions counselor, I felt Wartburg was the perfect fit, and I have been pleased with my decision ever since.

Internship at St. Andrew Lutheran Church

I am currently interning at St. Andrew Lutheran Church in Charlestown, Rhode Island, within the New England Synod. My duties include assisting in worship services, preaching, teaching confirmation classes and adult Bible study, planning worship and events, and serving on the stewardship team and budget committee. A significant project I'm involved in is building an outdoor sanctuary that includes a prayer labyrinth, organic garden, and memorial garden. This project is community-focused, and I have been actively participating in its various phases, from fundraising to planning and construction.

Embracing Permeable Edges

The St. Andrew's community believes strongly in creating a church environment that extends beyond the traditional boundaries of membership and Sunday services. It emphasizes inclusivity and community engagement through various activities and services that allow people to connect and feel part of the church community without needing to be formal members. For example, participating in yoga classes, food pantry services, or community dinners makes individuals part of the community. This approach seeks to reach out to more people, fostering connections and support networks within the community.

Outdoor Sanctuary Project

The outdoor sanctuary project is designed as a community initiative, not just for St. Andrew's. It aims to create a permanent worship space that can also serve multiple community functions such as funerals and weddings. The project includes building an organic garden, a prayer labyrinth, and a memorial garden. Fundraising and community involvement have been key components, and we have exceeded our financial goals. We are now in the clearing phase, preparing the site for construction, which will begin in early fall. The project has garnered significant support and involvement from local businesses and community members, highlighting our commitment to serving the broader community.

How Has Wartburg Prepared You for This Role?

Professor Samantha Gilmore and the preaching class really helped prepare me. Before I delivered my first sermon here on internship, the pastor took me aside and reassured me that this is a very forgiving congregation, that they show a lot of grace—all those things you would tell an intern on their very first sermon to reassure them. I had a normal amount of nerves leading up to it, but people told me afterward that I seemed so confident it seemed like I had been preaching for years. And I think having that preaching class and preparation was a direct influence to allow me to feel confident and step right into that role.
