Building Blocks of Faith 2.0

Good People,



As we continue our *Building Blocks of Faith* journey through the Easter season toward Pentecost, it has been awesome to see what you hold as the foundations of our faith. Each week you have written a response to a question posed in the sermon on a Jenga-like block in the Family Room. See picture below. Thus far the questions have been: *What helps you to see and believe in the risen Christ? Who or what is the resurrected Christ guiding you? What essential human needs build community?* Block by block, we are building something beautiful—honest reflections, faithful questions, and shared wisdom that strengthen our life together. You've done a remarkable job! So much so, that I had to purchase a second set of blocks!

Towards the end of May we will turn our attention to Acts 2:1–21, wherein we encounter the powerful moment of Pentecost, where the Holy Spirit descends and fills ordinary people with extraordinary gifts. This moment reminds us that the building blocks of faith are not static; they are alive, energized, and shaped by the Spirit. The same Spirit that stirred those first believers is at work among us—guiding, equipping, and empowering each of us to live out our faith with courage and compassion.

This is especially meaningful as we prepare to celebrate the confirmation of our youth on Sunday May 24. They are stepping forward, not with all the answers, but with a foundation—rooted in Scripture, shaped by community, and ignited by the Holy Spirit. Just like the early church, they are being gifted for a purpose: to witness, to serve, and to grow.

In May, we continue building together—asking, sharing, and trusting that the Spirit is meeting, guiding us in constructing all that is good.

WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
This week, we read a book about being respectful and patient with others. You can reinforce this idea at home by noticing kind and helpful moments together.	Invite your child to help carry their dishes to the kitchen after meals, and use the opportunity to discuss the importance of helping and taking turns. Keep the focus positive by thanking them for being a "little helper."	Helping with familiar routines supports your child in thinking about others. These everyday moments help build respect, patience and caring habits at home.

Curious Walk



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
This week, your child followed the path to different insects in the book. Continue the fun by looking for bugs together at home, outside or in books.	Take a walk and search for bugs up high and down low, discussing what you notice along the way. Follow your child's lead and share excitement about each discovery.	Exploring bugs together helps your child build curiosity about nature. When you show interest and enthusiasm, your child sees that it can be fun and safe to explore the world around them.

Diamond Hunt



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
Patterns and shapes took center stage in the story <i>Three Butterflies</i> this week. Keep the fun going by noticing shapes with your child at home.	Create a big diamond on the floor or table. Hide small diamond shapes for your child to find and place on the big diamond. Talk about the shapes as you play and celebrate each discovery together.	Searching for and matching shapes helps your child recognize shapes in fun, meaningful ways. Playing together also builds confidence and joy in learning.

Rhyme Time



WHAT?	HOW?	WHY?
This week, your child explored rhyming words and noticed how words can sound the same. You can join in by making up silly rhymes with your child during everyday moments.	As you walk or run errands together, choose one word you see and say a few words that rhyme with it. Laugh together and invite your child to repeat the rhymes.	Hearing and playing with rhymes helps your child notice sounds in words. These playful moments support early listening and language skills in a fun, low-pressure way.

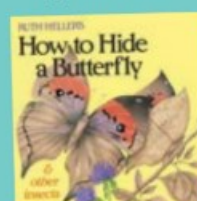

THIS MONTH'S THEME

Bugs & Crawly Things

Bugs & crawly things creep, crawl and fly their way around the classroom this month! Your child will learn about common bugs, their homes and their unique behaviors. Be ready to fly like a ladybug, crawl like a spider and buzz like a bee, as arts and crafts introduce the world of insects to your child. Bugs that may have seemed scary before will soon feel familiar and fun to explore.



Look for the daily notes about your child's art projects!



Children and Change

As the seasons change, it's a great time to encourage children to notice changes in their surroundings. Invite your child to look for something that is different from yesterday. It may be something familiar, like the clothing we wear, or something they notice outside, such as an insect. Talking with children about the changes they notice can help them feel comfortable and supported as their world changes around them.

Getting in Touch with Nature

Spending time with nature offers meaningful learning opportunities for children. If there are grass, trees or other natural spaces in or near your area, take time to explore them, care for them and use them as extensions of your child's classroom. Investigate items from nature, such as acorns, rocks, leaves or twigs to encourage discussion about the natural environment. If desired, you can bring some of these items home and set up your own "nature station," a place where nature exploration can continue indoors. Caring for plants, terrariums or bug habitats at home can offer children opportunities to care for living things and build empathy and responsibility.
