WORDS FROM Steve

On Sunday December 29, 2024, Amy and our girls worshipped at First Baptist Church in New Bern, North Carolina while visiting family. It is not very often I get to sit in the pew with Amy, all four of our daughters, and my mother-in-law, let alone in a pew that dates back to 1809. First Baptist is a member of the Cooperative Baptist Fellowship. From the handful of times we've worshipped there, I've always left there spiritually fed, and reminded that we Christians have more to stand together with, than apart. This Sunday was no different. The pastor preached from the lectionary, and we sang hymns found in our cranberry hymnal. Sure, our doctrine of the true presence of Christ in bread and wine, and their insistence on immersion baptism differ, but on this Sunday neither of them were obstacles to experiencing the presence of God and the attributes of baptism.

On this last Sunday of 2024 the minister preached from Matthew 25:31-46. In short, the passage features Jesus having a discussion with his disciples on the eve of his betrayal and death. Jesus talks about when he will come again to judge the living and the dead (Apostles Creed). Using a sheep and goats metaphor, Jesus describes God the Father's favor for the obedient sheep. He says, 'Come, you who are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world, for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.'

At first this reading just didn't seem to fit within the context of the Christmas season in which we celebrate the incarnation of God, the birth of hope. But, as the message unfolded, it came into focus. Jesus shares that those who are blessed and will inherit the kingdom, are those who have unknowingly practiced what Jesus preached and lived (fed, water, shelter, etc.) They repeatedly ask Jesus, "When was it that we..?"

This begs the question, How does one get to the point of not knowing/realizing that they are living what Jesus preached and lived? Perhaps it is in the question itself, "When was it that I..? When we recollect what we have, or have not done, in light of what God has done for us in Jesus, we spiritually position ourselves for better execution of God's love through us.

Later today, I will be taking a day hike in Croatan National Forest on the North Carolina seashore with my family. I am sure that hike will feed me in many ways. Physically, mentally and spiritually it will be good for my soul. They say that in order for us to properly care for others, we must care properly for ourselves.

On this News Year's Eve, the birth of a new year, might you create the time and space in this new year for recollecting the past. As a spiritual practice, might you filter the Word of God through walks or runs, times of silence, nurtured curiosities, art and literature. Or, listen or read up on a topic you disagree with, or troubles you.

In 2025, might you make it a spiritual practice to ask yourself this spiritually aware question, "When was it last that I did as Jesus did for the least of those around me?" In doing so, you and the kingdom will be spiritually fed for not just 2025, but well into eternity. Amen.

Inexpensive Ideas of for Learning at Home

Learning happens everywhere, all the time. Enhance your child's learning without spending a lot of money. Here are five quick ideas for activities at home, without added expenses.

- Go for a walk together with a paper bag. Collect items, then invite your
 child to create a nature book. Glue or tape an item on a page and write a story
 about it. Use descriptive words to describe how it looks and feels.
- Look through store ads or "junk mail" together. Invite your child to tear
 or cut them to make a collage.
- Sort and fold laundry together. Get a chore done while having fun! Match
 up socks and talk about colors, textures, patterns and sizes.
- Create upcycled treasures. Save items
 that can be recycled and use them to make
 three-dimensional sculptures. Set up an
 area protected with a plastic tablecloth, old
 sheet or newspapers and give your child
 free rein with tape, glue and rubber bands.
 Experiment with ways to build and create
 using those materials.

Dear readers:

There are few instances where we can recall people publicly admitting they were wrong, though as humans we should be saying that more often. However, this is one of those moments.

Last year Living Lutheran ceased as a print publication and continued as a digital-only service because of financial constraints. Running a monthly publication grew too expensive during a time of consolidated resources and shrinking readership. Since then, Presiding Bishop Elizabeth Eaton and staff have heard from many of you who have shared concerns about members who don't have access to computers or don't read content online for various reasons. As a result, people have felt disconnected from the ELCA.

We heard you and listened. At the request of Bishop Eaton, we have found a way to bring back the magazine's print publication. Beginning in 2025, *Living Lutheran* will again appear in your mailboxes with four issues a year (spring, summer, winter and fall). The cost for one year will be \$19.95 for an individual subscription and \$17 per year for a congregation group subscription.
