Living "In Between"

Through the course of our lives we find ourselves in in-between spaces quite often. In-between jobs. In-between homes. In-between church homes. We find ourselves in-between relationships, and at times we get in-between one another. But might these times, also be times of joy? Might these in-between times be opportunities for renewal and regrowth?

Yes, in-between can be uncomfortable. For instance, no one particularly cares for sitting in the middle of a car's backseat. If you grew up in a sizable family, you probably know what I'm talking about. There were tactics to avoid sitting in the middle seat. Remember? Whether it was a short journey to the store, or family vacation, as soon as you walked outside to get in the car, the first person that yelled "shotgun", got the front passenger seat. Granted, that's if an adult did not assume it by way of sheer seniority. Think about it, in-between is not so bad now after all, is it?

Nativity's new women's group has a name: Women of Worth (WOW for short)! We had such a fun time at Avocado Cantina in November!



This month will ignite your child's sense of sight and sound as they hear and see the beauty of the winter months. They will make a drum, a ribbon wand for dancing and a pretend piano. The journey confinues outside by hunting for sights and sounds in nature. Listen to the hoot of an owl, the crack of ice and ringing bells. Head inside to warm up and investigate familiar indoor sights and sounds. Hear a whistling teapot and the crunch of cookies. End the month by exploring light and dark during the short winter days. What lights up the night sky and what makes shadows? A full, fun month of sensory exploration fills this theme.

# **Improving Transitions**

A transition refers to any occurring change. Transitions can be stressful and frustrating for children who are either not ready to end their current activity or who struggle with change. Here are some ideas to help make transitions smoother for your child:

Give your child a preview. Prepare your child for transitions by alerting them of the upcoming change before it happens. The more your child can predict their routine, the smoother the day will flow.

Use music to ease transitions. Sing a favorite tune, changing the words to include your child's name and what needs to be done.

Here's an example (sung to the tune of 'Row Your Boat'):

Clean, clean, clean the room

Let's pick up the toys

Maggie is going to have some lunch
So let's clean up the room.

Introduce Movement Sticks.

Write movement words on craft sticks, such as "Jump like a frog," or "Hop on one foot." After your child has completed the desired task (e.g., putting away the blocks), encourage them to choose a craft stick and move in that way to the next activity (e.g. washing up for lunch).
