### **CULTURE CORNER**

DANIEL RALPH "DANNY RAY" WEBSTER ASSISTANT CHIEF OF DI-C FIRE COMPANY

What an amazing story to write! I do have to add that prying this story out of a humble man, who didn't like tooting his own horn, made him even more likable. The dedication of one fireman is in this article, a man who is entering his 50th year of duty to the island. As a rule, if the truth be known, ladies dream of a man in uniform and firemen are no exception.

Gene and Anne Webster would be so proud of the man, their son Danny Ray, has become. He and his 5 siblings were raised in a Christian home and church going was mandatory, but these are not the reasons for the many achievements of their son. Danny's success story is admired and his hard work getting to where he is today is a direct result of his ambition and drive.

He graduated from Deal Island High School in 1969, the last class from that school. Danny and I attended the same school from 1st grade to 11th grade. We didn't graduate in the same year as Danny had not completed the mandatory number of English classes which meant one more class for him. Soon after his graduation, Danny enlisted in the Coast Guard from 1970 to 1974, where he was ranked E-2 as a Machine Technician. He continued to serve with inactive duty for the next two years, but was not called. These two years proved to be a blessing for the Deal Island-Chance Fire Department. But I am getting ahead of myself here, read on!

While in the Coast Guard, he was stationed in Boston on the Lightship named "Boston", which was later refurbished and named the "Overfall" and now rests in the museum in Lewis, Delaware. Danny was fortunate to miss the war in Vietnam.

Danny's sister Jeanne, who has every right to be proud of her brother, recalled a special church service on Mother's Day at St. John's church in Deal Island, Md. She wrote an article which I got published in the book entitled No Time to Reef.



Unfortunately, her article got the wrong title by the printing that suggested he was in the Deal Island

Chance Lions Club. As we know, it should

have honored Danny with his title, a fireman! So today I get a second chance to make this right. Second chances are rare!

Danny wrote a special letter to be read in church to surprise Anne, his sweet Mother who had no idea what was going to happen. The pastor was asked to read the letter to the congregation and to begin by reciting Proverbs 31:10-31- the virtuous woman and signed it "I love you Mom and Dad from Danny Webster". There were not many dry eyes in church that day. This was an example of a man who thought of others and as Jeanne said, "doing the right thing". (This made me cry too).

After Danny's service to his country, he followed his Dad and brother Glenn in the Deal Island-Chance Fire Department in September 1974. He was President in 1981, 1982, and 1994. He was Chief Engineer in 1994-1996; he was Chief in 1996-2003 and was Assistant Chief in 2007 to this present day. He was the treasurer in 1995-1996, and 2004 to this present day.

His awards include perfect attendance in the years 1980, 1981, 1985, 1998, 2003, and 2011. Danny was voted Top Responder in 2011. He was also voted Fireman of the Year in 1995, 2007, 2008, 2010, 2013, 2016, 2021, and 2022. He was the recipient of the Jefferson award in 2017 in recognition of his community service.



Danny served as President of the Somerset County Fireman's Association. He was inducted into the Eastern

Shore Fireman's Hall of Fame in the year

2011. He serves on the house committee, the banquet committee, the fundraiser committee, the advisory board, and the board of directors for the Fire Department. I received this information from his sister, Jeanne from the article I mentioned above. Prying this information out of Danny Ray was not going to happen. I have never met a more humble man!

Apparently, Danny has the keys to the Firehouse and he has to approve all functions there. (talk about busy!) But that is not all, he was also the General Manager of the Phillip's Island Food Incorporated as it was called then. Much later it was called Kool Ice Seafood as it was sold to Jamie Harrington two years ago. Jamie thought of Danny as a valuable worker and asked him to stay on. Of course, this added to a busy crabbing season with Danny putting in long hours at Kool Ice and being so active in the Fire Department. Yet Danny Ray is rarely seen without that big smile that I remember from high school. Maybe he hears the beat of a different drummer? Wish that I heard it too!

Eventually that mysterious waterman's blood revealed itself in the island boy. Danny's grandfather, Valiant, was the Captain of several Skipjacks, but being a Captain of a Skipjack was not in Danny's destiny. He did have a working crab boat named the Rosalyn Ann. Many years later, Danny thought of a better use for his boat. She was sold to the Fire Department in 2015 as a rescue boat to help any waterman or any boat in distress! She was refurbished in 2020, painted red with new motors and renamed Marine 401 when she was considered active and ready for duty.

Danny says Marine 401 has been very busy with calls from sinking boats and stranded boats. Danny Ray is the Captain.



He told me that she has a crew specially trained for water disasters and laughed when I asked him where he got his training and where did the crew receive it? He responded, "I trained myself and the crew". Yes indeed, just one more job for Captain Danny Ray!

Danny Ray serves as the Treasurer of the Watermen's Association and did serve on the Tidal Fish Advisory Commission with the Department of National Resources. He is the Chairman of the Oyster Shell Committee for Somerset County and was a spokesperson for the Waterman's Affairs in Annapolis. He has lobbied several bills introduced to legislators on behalf of the waterman. During these times, he forfeited many days pay without reimbursement. Danny Ray is a true man of integrity! How many of us would work for free? Not me.

Danny Ray has one son, Danny Jr., who teaches the Paramedic Program at Warwic Tech. For sure, the service to others in making the community a safer place to live and that dedication is felt by his son as if the service was contagious or genetic.



Danny Ray's granddaughter, Miranda, is a Paramedic Firefighter in the Salisbury Fire Department. This is the third active

generation of firefighters, as his Dad was a firefighter with the Deal Island-Chance Fire

Department. Gene Webster would be so happy to see that the legacy lives on! Four generations of dedication to the community!

What an outstanding family, one of love, compassion, and endless service! Not many families can live up to this one, as God has blessed the Webster's with the gift that keeps on giving.

This article has blessed me beyond my wildest dreams. I pray Danny finds time to read this, lol.
