Ready & Willing to Respond

Since October 2021, Greenfield and Clifford Townships have been responding to emergency calls from 6:00 a.m. – 6:00 p.m. seven days per week, with paid EMT crews and no signs of slowing down. The paid crew and Township Supervisors' partnership between the two fire companies has been successful to date, as calls have increased significantly within

the area. Having the paid crew ready to respond every day is a relief to volunteers who do not have to worry about rapid response time or scrambling to have someone available to help.

"If Greenfield or Clifford can't respond to a call, you could be waiting 20 - 30 minutes for a nearby paid crew to respond," said Joe Palermo, a member of the paid crew, who works about three times a week. "When you're dealing with a life-or-death situation, we all know that seconds count."

"For me, I recognize the importance of being part of this crew who are always available, especially when we respond to female patients," said Mia Vitali, who also works at least three times week or more. "It's definitely crucial being able to interact with females and they appreciate it during sensitive situations."

There are 15 paid EMS crew members that support both Greenfield and Clifford Townships and rotate throughout the week. However, with most working other jobs, they must rely on a handful of members who are available for steady shifts. Since the partnership has been so successful and beneficial to our community, more staff are needed.

CHIEF'S REPORT By Kyle Durko

With warm weather approaching, let's talk about water safety! Follow these swimming and boating safety tips:

- **Provide Constant Adult Supervision** Actively supervise children and non-swimmers around the water, even when lifeguards are present. Don't just drop kids off. Avoid distracting activities such as checking email or social media.
- Learn to Swim No matter your age, learning to swim is one of the best ways to be safer in and around the water.
- **Look for Lifeguards** Swim in designated areas supervised by lifeguards.
- **Swim with A Buddy** Do not allow anyone to swim alone. Even at a public pool or a lifeguarded beach, use the buddy system.
- Wear A Life Jacket Adults and kids should always wear a
 properly-fitted U.S. Coast Guard-approved life jacket while boating.
 Non-swimmers and inexperienced swimmers should also always
 wear a life jacket when in and around the water. Inflatable toys can
 be fun but are not a substitute for U.S. Coast Guard-approved life
 jackets.
- Learn CPR Learn how to prevent and respond to emergencies by learning CPR.
