

CO-RIDER'S ROLE IN AN EMERGENCY


We recently attended the Tennessee Rally. While at rally we attended the new Co-Rider classroom seminar. Melanie Geggie, a GWRRA University Instructor did a great job presenting the seminar. I enjoy observing the safety information being presented to our members as well as their feedback on any given subject. These classes are always presented with the understanding that they are for your information and you are to choose and evaluate if the information can be used by you to safely operate your bike or trike.

I like being surrounded at rally's by new acquaintances. I enjoy listening to their war stories and mishaps they or someone in their group encountered. Often the mishaps I hear about were either due to lack of training or forgetting to use techniques the rider learned in one of our classes.

There are many useful tips given to the Co-Rider in our Co-Rider Seminars. I would like to give you a few more things to consider for both the Rider and Co-Rider to keep you safe. One of the useful suggestions in the class is that if the Rider becomes incapacitated and

slumps forward in the seat, the Co-Rider can lean forward and take control of the handlebars of the bike or trike. The Co-Rider is to then shut off the Engine Cut -off Switch, let the engine slow down the motorcycle, and start steering toward the shoulder of the road. The motorcycle will eventually come to an abrupt stop and if on two wheels the bike will finally fall over, with you on it. The Co-Rider is told not to pull in the clutch or apply the front down. Some of the Trike brake which is the appropriate advice given the appropriate set of circumstances.

I would like to give you some more possible scenarios and solutions to consider. What if when the Rider slumps over you are in the middle lane of the highway and the traffic ahead and to the sides of you is stopping for a red light at approximately 45mph? Turning off the Engine Cut-off switch to slow down the motorcycle is not going to be enough. There is no escape path in this scenario if vou have cars on both sides and in front of you. How the Co-Rider should react here would be much different. Whether you are riding a two-wheel motorcycle or three-wheel motorcycle would have a significant difference on how the Co-Rider should react. If you



are on three-wheels there is no danger of falling over. The Co-Rider could apply the front brake to stop the motorcycle. If the front wheel skids (which it will probably do) there is no danger of the Trike falling Kits on 2018 Gold Winas and newer connect the front wheel ABS to the rear trike wheel's ABS. Can-Ams mostly have ABS brakes. Therefore the front wheel brakes would not lock up. Using the front brake to stop might just make the difference between running into the back of the vehicle in front of you or not. How about two-wheel motorcycles? Some have ABS and some do not. The ones that do have ABS will not skid. The ones that do not have ABS can skid which would result in the bike going down. Riders of the non-ABS bikes must discuss this with their Co-Riders advising them of this possibility. It would of great benefit for the non-ABS two-wheel Riders to train their Co-Riders on how to properly apply the front brake of their motorcycle to keep the bike

from skidding and bring the motorcycle to a complete stop (preferably in a vacant parking lot). In either case at the final stop the two-wheel motorcycle is going to fall over. Riders must advise your Co-Riders to kick away from the falling motorcycle as not to get trapped under the 900 lb machine. It does the Co-Rider no good if they are trapped under the motorcycle along with the unconscious Rider.

There are other times when just steering off the shoulder is not possible. How about when there is a quard rail or there is no guard rail and a 200 ft drop off. I am sure you can think of plenty of other situations where having to stop the motorcycle quickly with the front brake is the correct choice. I heard a story while in Tennessee of one scenario I had not considered. As the story was told, there was a Rider and Co-Rider traveling on a Trike. A deer jumped across the Trike taking the Rider with it. The Co-Rider was left with a riderless Trike. All survived due to ATGATT. How would you have liked to have been that pair of riders?

We at GWRRA can learn from each other's real life experiences as well as proper Rider and Co-Rider training. It is our goal to pass on all the information we can to help make your ride safe and enjoyable.



Thankfully it's not another virus we have to worry about.



The police have found a large number of dead crows on the 101 just north of Ventura early this morning, and there was concern that they may have died from Avian Flu,

A Pathologist examined the remains of all the crows, and, to everyone's relief, confirmed the problem was NOT Avian Flu. The cause of death appeared to be from vehicular impacts.
