SAVICE SCHOLARSHIP REPORT 2010

I. SCHOLARSHIP SUMMARY 2010 - 2011 SCHOOL YEAR

At the grade-school level, 707 SAVICE scholarship applications were reviewed and accepted for funding in 2010. Existing funding to **18** scholarships were renewed for a total of **725** scholarships. Of these, 366 were given to junior high school students, and 359 were given to high school students. In total, SAVICE distributed **USD 47,356.02** or the equivalent of **904,500,000 VND**.

SAVICE scholarships for university students were given to **33** successful applicants. Of the 33, five were renewal of funding to 2009 inaugural university recipients and **28** were first-time awardees. SAVICE university scholarships totaled **USD 5,183.25** or the equivalent of **99,000,000 VND**.

SAVICE scholarship spending totaled **USD 52,539.27** or the equivalent of **1,003,500,000 VND**.

My name is Nguyễn Yến Oanh. I was in grade 7 in the school year 2009-2010, and achieved advanced student status. This school year I am in grade 8. My family consists of four people, my grandfather, grandmother, father and me. My father had a traffic accident four years ago that paralyzed both his legs. He can no longer walk or stand and relies on my grandparents for financial support. My grandparents support both my father and me. My mother separated from my father before the accident.

Now I take care of my father. In the morning I make sure he gets his breakfast and medicine before going to school. At lunch I come home to have lunch with my father. Sometimes we have boiled greens or squash.

I wish that in the future there will be many supporters of SAVICE and the sentiments they represent will carry me through the rest of my studies.

With your support I am determined to be a good student so that one day, I can contribute in some small way to SAVICE to help other students living in poor conditions.
