Today, absolute truth, something that is true at all times and in all places, seems to be treated more like a myth than a reality. Our society tells us that it's narrow-minded, naive, ignorant, hateful, or whatever else negative descriptor you want to add, to believe that there is such a thing as absolute truth.

Yet scripture tells us the opposite! Jesus tells us He is the truth (John 14:6). The Holy Spirit is described as the Spirit of truth, who will in turn guide us into truth (John 16:13). And don't forget the great promise of John 8:32 which tells us that we can "know the truth, and the truth will set you free."

So where does that leave us? Should Christians really be concerned with trying to defend absolute truth? Is it worth putting a big bulls-eye on ourselves to declare that there is absolute truth and his name is Jesus Christ?

In a Focus on Family online article entitled "Absolute Truth in a Relativistic World" it helps illuminate the dire consequences of getting away from absolute truth. It reads:

If we have ultimate truth, it gives us both a way to explain the world around us and a basis for making decisions. Without it, we're alone. We're just 6 billion organisms running around, bumping into each other with nothing unifying to work for or believe in. It's every man for himself. And we're without a purpose; if there's no true story of where we came from and why we're here, then there's nothing that really gives our lives meaning.

The TRUTH of the matter is that absolute truth (God himself) gives life meaning, purpose, morality, and so much more! And the TRUTH is that <u>now</u> is time the church needs to stand up for the absolute truth (even under the threat of harassment, oppression or persecution).

Remember truth will set you free! But let's not forget to add context to that verse by looking at the verse that precedes it — 31 To the Jews who had believed him, Jesus said, "If you hold to my teaching, you are really my disciples. 32 Then you will know the truth, and the truth will set you free.

To be set free, we must obey him. We must be his disciples. Then we can know the truth and that truth will set us free. So I invite you to join us in person or online as we seek to know

and live out absolute truth. We will seek to cling to his teaching that there is only One God, One Way to Heaven, One Church and One Mission. We will experience life as his disciples as we rally around these absolute truths.

Join us for this series beginning on Sunday, August 16th as we are concluding our look at some of the characteristics of God found in the letters of John.

And remember, God is good all the time. And all the time God is good. That's the truth!
