More Happenings in Hunt Garden Club

Beehives (Beth Gaddie)

The bee committee works so hard to care for our bees but despite our best efforts, we have lost one of our bee hives to the wax moths AGAIN. This is the third year in a row we have been affected by the wax moths. The wax moth larva burrow into the wood of the hive boxes causing severe damage. We have taken all of the steps possible other than fumigating to control the situation. With the last wax moth infestation, the boxes were deemed simply too damaged to be used anymore so they were discarded. At this point we either need to purchase new hive boxes to run a second hive or just operate one hive. We have requested an additional \$220 from the club to purchase a new apiary kit and nuc of bees.
