High on the Wildscape priority list was to purchase new plants from the Fall Plant Sale (joint sale by Riverside Nature Center, Texas Master Naturalists, Native Plant Society of Texas). We were fortunate to receive a very timely and generous anonymous donation. That, in addition to our annual budget, gave us more purchase power this year!

The stars were aligned for our team of ladies to launch a significant makeover of the Wildscape this fall. Our vision includes removing several plants that were either in the wrong place, or overgrew their space, etc. and also removing large sections of weed barrier. We worked for about a two week period prepping beds and planting 54 native plants and scattering some native seeds. Our focus is on creating areas of massed plants of the same or similar type.
