### What's Happening in **Hunt Garden Club?**

Treasurer (Tracy Belew) - see attached Treasurer's report.

Parliamentarian (Gretchen Harris-Report given by Sandy Griffin) -

Please read attached Report. The final draft of the updated Constitution, Bylaws, addendum for Email Voting and Standing Rules for the Club has been completed. The updated documents clarify terms, quidelines, roles and responsibilities of all club members and provide consistent language throughout. These updates will be attached to the newsletter for all members to review. There will be time on the April general meeting agenda for questions from members and a vote to approve the updates will be held at the general meeting in May.

Beehive Project (Vivian Morse) - In spite of our precautions taken prior to the February storms - including insulating the hive with bales of hay and a heavy duty canvas oil tarp - our bees did not survive the historically low and prolonged winter temperatures. This loss is an obvious setback to the Project's plans for providing lessons at the Hunt School via the Discovery Garden program. The good news is that, even though there were bee losses locally, other beekeepers' hives survived the severe cold, and honey bees (and bumble bees) can now be seen around the emerging spring wild flowers.



**Awards (Karen Taylor)** - Our Club received 17 FIRSTPLACE awards and one SECOND PLACE at the **District VII Convention** – well done ladies!

The Hunt Garden Club also raked in the awards at the **Texas Garden Clubs 93**<sup>rd</sup> **Annual Spring Convention**. ### More Happenings

Blue Star Memorial Marker ( Karen Taylor) – The BSM committee met on Sunday, March 21st. Luckily, none of the existing plants at the BSM were killed during the hard freeze we experienced in February. We cut things back, trimmed the oak tree and cleaned up the area. No new plants will be added this year, so maintenance moving in to the summer months will hopefully be minimal.

**Hydroponic Tower (Bernadell Larson)** – The children are very interested and excited about their hydroponic garden. The first lesson was on March 23rd discussing the history of lettuce and the rock wool growing medium, with the students starting their seed. The next week was spent discussing the food distribution system and the differences between local/regional and national/international sys-tems. At the third week lesson, the students measured their plant's root and top growth and prepared their lettuce for planting in the hydroponic system. The lesson are scheduled to wrap up on May 4th, with some type of project celebration on May 18th.

Discovered a crack in the piping from the pressure tank and one on the pump in the greenhouse. There were also 2 sprinkler heads broken. Effective April 2 everything is repaired. (So we can now use the water catchment.) We also met with Faith Bradberry (science teacher) and presented her with the DG award certificates from last year. We discussed plans for the 4th graders to plant flowers and radishes. On March 29, approximately 12 ladies from the DG team spent all morning moving compost onto the garden beds in preparation for the 4th graders to plant. We delivered seeds and planting instructions to Faith. The 4th graders planted marigolds, zinneas and radishes in the garden the same week.
