Hydroponic Gardening -Bernadell Larsen

Melissa, Mike and Bernadell met with Hunt School teacher, Faith Bradbury, on January 28th to discuss the Hydroponic Gardening project. There will be 7 weekly lessons starting after Spring Break, with the last week being a wrap up and celebration. The lessons are currently being developed and archived so that they can be used in succeeding years. The actual system is almost complete; we are just waiting on the pump to arrive. The students will be growing lettuce this first semester and will be responsible for maintaining the system and ensuring an optimal growing condition. The history of lettuce will be the first lesson. Last Fall, Karen Taylor submitted an application for a \$1,000 Plant America grant through the National Garden Clubs. We were disappointed to be notified that we were not awarded the grant; but instead, the project will be funded through the HGC budget.
