

Hydroponics (Bernadell Larson) -

Hydroponic team had their first lesson with the fifth graders on Tuesday, December 6th. The students were introduced to the concept of hydroponic gardening and planted a lettuce seed. (The seed is placed in rock wool in a plastic basket and the basket is then placed in the system specifically designed for the school.) The students were very interested and asked some very good questions about the growing process. The next lesson with the team will be on January 10th, but Ms. Bradberry and the students will be monitoring the growth of the lettuce plants until the next lesson.

Bernadell is looking for a replacement for next Fall and It would be nice if those interested could shadow this season so they would see the entire session.

December 2nd, Dusty Gilliam and I worked for several hours in the Presidents Garden, trimming and cutting back on the vegetation and pulling vines off the fence, among other things. Dusty used her string trimmer to cut back the grass from the front of that garden to the roadway, giving it a well cared for appearance! The dead Sotol "bloom spikes" were taken out as well.

The Mountain Laurel was given a pruning of unwanted new growth at it's base, again making a neater looking result. More pruning appears to be necessary, saved for another maintenance visit. We also discussed future trimming back of the lantana after the winter. That is one enthusiastic plant which still had some blooms currently attracting butterflies, I am happy to report!
