FEBRUARY PROGRAM 1st Annual HGC Seed Swap and Book Swap!

"Friendship through Gardening"

What is a SEED SWAP?

A gathering of people, usually gardeners and farmers, who have come together to share seeds. The seeds can include

locally saved seeds, excess bought seeds, seeds brought back from another region or country, or excess seeds that a seed company donated — you decide what you want to swap. A seed swap is an opportunity for gardeners to organize their seed collections and get rid of the ones they don't want. They can also use the event to pick up seeds that they do want to grow. In all, it's a win-win for gardeners and reduces wastage and cost.

Our event is about giving seeds a chance to grow, saving money on buying new seeds, creating an opportunity to pick up new varieties, and making the event a social gathering where gardeners can talk about all things green and growing.

Tips for a Successful Seed Swap

1. Seeds should only be saved from trusted and proven varieties.

2. Consider the viability of the seeds. The older a seed is, the worse its germination rate will be. Limit the swap to seeds no more than 2 years old for the best quality.

3. Make sure you include enough seeds in each packet to ensure a decent harvest. A dozen tomato or pepper seeds is more than enough, but for a crop like corn or beans, it makes more sense to include at least 20.

4. Packaging is important. Mini plastic ziptop bags or manila coin envelopes make great seed packets. Organize and label the seed packets with the variety, basic growing information, and your name so the recipient can contact you if they have any questions.

What is a BOOK SWAP?

Book swapping or book exchange is the practice of a swap of books between one person and another. It provides an inexpensive way for people to exchange books, find out about new books and obtain a new book to read without having to pay. Books are a banquet, and when it comes to luscious descriptions and delicious dialogue, nothing beats sharing the wealth with a friend -- or lots of friends. That's where a book swap can make your reading life richer. Sure, you'll net a few more fun books to read, but you'll also be able to share your favorites with people who also think a great book is a moveable feast. Our book swap will be a great way to pass on books you love and find new treasures from those you trust.

Tips for a Successful Book Swap

1. You can leave as many books as you like, just make sure they are your own.

2. Make sure your book is clean and in good condition.

3. Leave a note as to why you liked your book or books for the next reader.
