HGC members please start saving seeds for the tree and seed sale to be held this Fall. Flowering plants may bloom and seed earlier this year due to the dry weather, so please keep the seed sale in mind! Reviewing results from last year's sale, we sold over 30 different kinds of wildflower/forb and tree seeds, with Bluebonnets as the top seller. Sales also included Moon Flower/Jimsonweed, Poppies, Purple Coneflower, Milkweeds (Texas, Antelope Horn, Pearl Vine), Blackfoot Daisy, Columbine, Anacacho Orchid, Gregg's Mistflower, Larkspur, Orange Cosmos, Plains Coreopsis, Pride of Barbados, Red Yucca, Horsemint, Hollyhock, Hyacinth Vine, Mexican Sunflower, Rain Lily, Rock Rose, and Shasta Daisy, among others and our "Meadow Mix" of seeds for deer-resistant plans like Cowpen Daisy, Mexican Hat, and Mealy Blue Sage. We also sold some Arugula, Sweet Basil, and Cilantro. We can



expand this year to add more types of seeds so don't feel restricted to what was sold last year. Thank you to Joni and last year's seed savers! We hope to build on your success and look forward to another fun seed packaging party.
