
More Happenings

The Wildscape team met at Lift Coffee (new place in Ingram) to discuss plans for near future projects/ tasks for improving the Wildscape. First on the list was to finalize the watering schedule through the growing season and the summer. We're continuing to be very cautious in use of water for the Wildscape since we are still observing some level of water restrictions. With this in mind, we also decided not to plant any new plants this year. We will continue to harvest seeds from the native plants - the Bluebonnets and Damianitas have already relinquished their bounty. Admittedly, I am a bit obsessed with the Pearlvine Milkweed as it continues to grow and spread. It will no doubt have a great yield of seed pods.

One of our areas of focus we started last fall was to give some attention to supporting the birds in the area. We have plants that produce berries and seeds, which is great, but we've expanding the support to include hanging two bird houses. We are also working on maintaining a reliable water source for the birds. We will not be putting any bird feeders in the Wildscape because we don't want to encourage rodents, who would also feast on the birdseed!

We have one other major project we will be working on. Stay tuned!
