- Pink and White Guara,
- · Purple coneflowers,
- Creeping Germander, and
- Antelope Horn Milkweed

(donated by a Texas Master Naturalist).

We will be setting up a watering schedule to carry us through the summer, but we've all been very fortunate for the occasional rain, heavy mist, and cloudy days. This all has helped get new plants off to a great start. The other thing the team will be doing before it gets too hot is putting down more mulch. This will spruce things up as well as provide much needed moisture retention during the summer.


