Born of God means receiving eternal life. Jesus referred to this as "born again" in John 3:3-6.

What does it say one must do to get this birth? See also John 1:12-13.

The new birth places one in a new family of believers where love for the Father's other children is expected.

Not until a person stops working for righteousness will he accept God's righteousness through faith. See Romans 3:21-22.

The verse corrects those who try to be right with God by their works, since God justifies the ungodly.

What is the stated purpose of Christ dying for sins?

His single sacrifice paid for all sins for all men for all time. See Heb. 10:10-14.

Being sinless, Christ alone was qualified to pay the death penalty for the unjust.

Note the two conditions--hear and believe--for eternal life. Notice also the verb "has." We get life now, not after death.

Why no judgment? Our judgment is past, not future, since it fell upon Christ, our substitute.

The believer, having passed from death into life, is destined for heaven.

Body means Christ's church. The word "drink" is explained in John 7:37-39.

What does this baptism of the Spirit do for believers?

The Spirit is received when we believe the gospel. See Eph. 1:13-14 and Gal. 3:14.

Jesus affirmed that God had spoken. He believed the Scriptures were those words. See Mt. 22:31-32 for an example.

The word of God is said to be spiritual food. Believers are urged to feed on it.

To receive forgiveness of sins, what must one do?

Why is believing enough? Because believing means to trust in, to depend upon, and to rely upon the death of Christ as full payment for our sins. See Acts 13:38-39.

Wages are what we earn and deserve. We have earned death.

In contrast, a gift cannot be earned. It is free to the recipient, but it cost the giver.
What is the gift and what is its source?

Growing in grace is learning to be satisfied with the work of Christ for us and not seeking further approval by good works. See Philippians. 3:9.

The result? More glory for Him.

This verse helps to define grace; it excludes works. Grace is the unmerited favor of God toward sinners. It is always free.

What happens if works are added to grace? See Rom. 4:4

Notice how salvation is explained by several contrasts.

The words "and this" refer to salvation, not faith.

Grace salvation was designed to eliminate what? See also I Cor. 1:30-31.

"Yoke of slavery" refers to the bondage of Moses' law according to Acts 15:10.

Having been set free of the law, the believer is told to stand firm in his Christ-purchased liberty.

Paul believed that if one submitted to any part of the O.T. he would lose his freedom. See Gal. 5:3.

How many things did they do to receive the Spirit?

"Sealed" means God's stamp of approval and ownership.

The gospel promises salvation, but God also gives the Spirit to live in believers as a guarantee of eternal life. See Rom. 8:11.

Men have always wanted to work for God to earn his approval, but Jesus here identifies the work that God wants.

When a person believes in the one sent, he honors both the Father and the Son.

How will men know that you are a disciple of Christ?

Living by the new commandment fulfills all the commandments of the former law age. See Rom. 13:8-10.

Jesus' commandments are futher explained in I John 3:22-23.

Moses introduced merit living under law. But Jesus was not another lawgiver. His death ended the law age and established the age of living by grace. See Rom. 10:4.

Believers are told to grow in grace, but never in the law.

But now we are discharged from the law, dead to that which held us captive, so that we serve not under the old written code but in the new life of the Spirit. Anyone who takes comfort from trying to live by the commandments is warned here that breaking one law makes him a law-breaker, and he stands condemned.

This is bad news for those who hope in a legal righteousness.

The New Testament tells us that there is a righteousness apart from law which God wants to give us. (Romans 3:21-22)

This statement confirms the identity of Jesus as the "Word" in vs 1, and refers to His human birth.

By describing Him as full of grace and truth, John emphasizes that Jesus came bringing undeserved salvation along with the truth of God. (See also verse 17.)

God does not delight in punishing sinners. This verse proclaims His desire that all be saved. Repentance means a change of mind toward the Creator.

The passage refers to the promise of the return of the Lord.

The complete submission of Jesus to the Father is revealed here. As a servant of God, Jesus offered men no ideas of His own. Likewise, men who want to serve God today must teach the Scriptures only. There is no divine expectation that a prophet or teacher be creative.

God has spoken and His wisdom is found nowhere except in the Scriptures.

The words "fulness" (vs 9) and "complete" (vs 10) are from the same Greek word. Because Christ is complete, the believer in Christ is spiritually complete, having had the total righteousness of Christ credited to him.

To be complete in Him means to be totally acceptable to the Father. Nothing can be added to completeness. "In Him" is a frequent N. T. expression meaning "united with Christ."

Paul quotes Psalm 14:3. In the sight of men some are righteous, but not before God. God does not grade on the curve. His passing grade is perfection.

Not even the best of men and women score 100, and a single sin disqualifies them from the presence of the sinless Father in heaven.

An inward witness is the result of faith in God's Son, and this testimony is the basis of peace and assurance.

When a man does not believe what God has said about His Son, he implies that God has lied and will not give eternal life as He promised. However, God cannot lie. His word alone is trustworthy.

The verse answers the question "What must I do to be saved?" The single requirement to "believe" confirms that salvation is by faith alone in Christ alone.

"Your household" extended salvation to his family and slaves under the same requirement. No one can be saved because he is a member of a Christian's family as explained in John 1:12-13. Jesus teaches the way to eternal life by the event in Num. 21:5-9. Read it. The Israelites were told only to look, not to pray, promise or make a sacrifice. Since the bronze serpent had no power, their look was with faith in God who promised to preserve life.

Today instead of looking, we are told to believe in the crucified Christ as our remedy for sin. Faith alone was the remedy in both cases.

Jesus here expresses the Father's single standard for mankind.

Since Christ alone met the standard, only those united to Him by faith are acceptable to the Father. Jesus insisted that He was the only way to the Father.

The only other way to God is to be perfect!

This was written to confirm that salvation which is based on the testimony of God is certain.

Apart from the written word, none could be sure of eternal life. But God wants believers to *know*.

The "hope so" Christian lacks the inward witness of God. He may be doubting instead of believing.

Christ is called the "Word" because He is the perfect expression of the Father. Jesus was all that God wanted to be, to do and to say to men. (John 14:9-11)

Vs 1 teaches that Christ existed prior to taking on human form, and was equal to God, yet a distinct person. Jesus is God the Son, the eternal God-man. (See John 1:14.)

Writing to Jews in the church, Paul declares that the gospel has released them from the bondage of the Mosaic law because Christ died, fulfilling its death demand. Believers are therefore no longer under its jurisdiction.

When a believer today tries to live by law he opts for captivity instead of the liberty which Christ purchased for him.

Because Christ spoke for God in all things, His voice is the voice of God. In both word and deed He represented the Father; therefore He is *the* truth.

His resurrection to life eternal is convincing proof of His claim to be *the* life.

Access to the Father by either Jew or Gentile can be gained only through the one sent to be the mediator.

Christ is Abraham's offspring who became a blessing to all nations.

The law was a temporary provision to control God's people from Moses' time until the cross. Since the law of Moses was until Christ, it cannot be in force after Christ.

Therefore, Christians should not be concerned with that obsolete law code since they have a "new commandment" from Christ which fulfills all the old law. (Gal. 5:14) See also Heb. 8:13.

The quotation from Gen. 15:6 confirms that God declares men who believe as righteous in His sight. "Reckoned" means credited. Righteousness was entered on his account.

It does not say that Abraham believed in God. Instead he believed what God had promised to do for him.
