"Stubborn" is often an adjective used to describe the dogs humans feel are not responding to - or blatantly disregarding - their cues.


But is it really that simple? Not at all!

THE FOREVER DOG BOOK

K9 Body Language 101: The Wagging Dog Tail



Who doesn't love a wagging dog tail?

While most people believe this means a happy dog who is ready to meet you, **a wagging tail is also one of the most misunderstood dog behaviors!** Below, we'll clear up the misconceptions.

As with all canine behavior, **context is crucial!** In other words, notice **all** the K9's body language cues for an proper interpretation.

If a dog is wagging their tail, also take notice of the tail's position, body stance and the dog's facial expressions.

For example:

- A **tucked-in or low, fast-wagging tail** indicates a dog who is scared or unsure. Refrain from approaching them to aggravate the situation.
- A **highly-held tail with a stiff wag** means the dog is excited, agitated, or aroused. If the body is also stiff, positioned forward, and their ears are up or forward, be careful.
- A **loose, broad, and sweeping wag** (that is neither high, nor really low nor tucked in) typically means a dog that is comfortable and friendly. But again, **notice the overall body language first**. Look for other signs of friendliness such as soft eyes, a "smiling" mouth with a loose jaw, and a loose, wiggly body!

Even licking the vapor off their fur can increase the risk of negative health conditions.

There's also a risk of the pet chewing or swallowing parts of the e-cigarette, the vaping liquid, or even the battery.
