

New York Giants Fact Sheet

History of the New York Giants:

- The New York Football Giants first joined the National Football League in 1929 as “The New York National League Football Company” but later changed the name to the “New York Football Giants” in 1932.
- The team originally played at the Polo Grounds in upper Manhattan but later moved to East, Rutherford, NJ.
- The reason the organization included “Football” in the official title of the team was due to the fact that there was a New York Giants baseball team. Although the baseball team later moved to San Francisco, the football team legally kept the name “New York Football Giants.”

Current New York Giants Facts:

- The Giants play in the NFC East division, against the Philadelphia Eagles, Washington Commanders and Dallas Cowboys.
- About 14.9 million people watch a regular-season NFL game on TV, this does not include streaming services.
- The owner of the Giants is John Mara. The Mara family has owned the Giants since the team’s creation and different family members have taken control throughout the years.
- The current head coach of the team is Brian Daboll. The starting quarterback is Daniel Jones.

Finances and Demographics of the New York Giants:

- The Giants' franchise value is \$4.3 million

- The revenue of the New York Giants, a franchise of the National Football League, exceeded pre-pandemic levels in 2021. The revenue of the New York Giants was at 584 million U.S. dollars in 2021, denoting an increase of 66.86 percent over the previous year.
