

The Grand Opening day will bring many surprises just an all out family day for all to enjoy. The So Classic Car Show will start loading in at 7:30 am 40 Vendors for the first of many Saturday Markets. Live Music for the day and of course the Dedication Ceremony will start at 10 am.

GETTING TO KNOW OUR MAYOR



GULFPORT MAYOR SAM HENDERSON

We wanted to know who is driving Gulfport so here is another in depth interview: Knowing Mayor Henderson for a few years now it has been a pleasure to become a part of his extended family.

This reporter and the rest of the city have watched as he has directed the city and even had the chance to share in his family so thank you for all you do for our city Mayor Sam:

Q: So tell me about your life before Gulfport and what brought you here.

I'm a North Carolina native from the Asheville area, and have lived in Ohio and Texas as well. I've worked every sort of job you can think of – bartender, singer (search for Hot Souse on Spotify to hear a little), Geotech driller, metal fabrication, actor (extra on a few Matlock episodes and one professional production of A Few Good Men), mover, forklift operator, photographer, landscaper, women's clothing and jewelry salesman, air quality consultant, burger flipper, industrial demolition, FEMA inspector, powder coat painter – you name it.

Most of my professional career since my late twenties has focused on environmental remediation and that led me here to do environmental work at Tyndall and MacDill Air Force Bases. I, my wife Laura and daughter Brenna came here in 2006 and have lived in our same little 900 sq. ft. bungalow ever since. I received an A.S. degree in **Environmental Technology from Stark** State College, and in the last decade earned a B.S. in Environmental Science and Policy and an M.A. in Public Policy and Ecology from USFSP. I've always been politically active, but never really had aspirations to run for office until I moved here.

Q: How did that become part of your life?

Honestly, it was a pretty organic chain of events. I wanted to throw a block party in 2007 to get to know my neighbors, so I went to a council meeting to ask permission and learn the rules. Then I started attending those meetings and paying attention to what we were doing and not doing in local government.

When I watched a previous Council turn down an opportunity with USF College of Marine Science to install free water quality monitoring buoys in Clam Bayou and Boca Ciega Bay, I decided to run. I was elected to the Ward 4 seat in 2009, again in 2011 and later for two terms as Mayor. I'm in my 10th consecutive year of doing a job that would never have been on my radar had it not been for my desire to throw a party. By the way, I did get permission, and we've thrown several good ones since.

Q: What has kept you doing a job that was never part of your life plan?

Number one, I really care about preserving and improving this city.
Gulfport is a special place, and it has been my home for 13 years now. I want to do things in office that will be a benefit to our residents for many years to come.

We have to walk that delicate balance of protecting the character of our town while still keeping us poised for economic success.

Number two, in local government you can actually see your efforts and policy decisions come to fruition. It's much easier to get things done at this level, and you get to see the city take shape year after year. Plus, our election races are non-partisan which allows for a much more collegial dialogue among Councilmembers.

The big stuff that separates us at the State and Federal level are not the topics that we regularly tackle here in the city. This goes a long way toward helping people with very diverse beliefs and principles work together.

And three, we have had so many successes over the last ten years. I'm not ready to walk away from that yet. In lean times and prosperity, we have been able to do some pretty incredible things for the city. We have a talented, hardworking staff, a caring community and due to the work of the present Council and many past Councils we have kept Gulfport strong and resilient.

Q: What do you consider to be your greatest achievements and what would you have done differently?

First of all, no achievements are mine alone. I am one vote out of five, and without the support of Council and City Staff, nothing would get done. No single person makes any of this work. It is truly a cooperative effort, and that includes the input and ideas of the people who live here.

I think our infrastructure initiatives are among our best projects. Accelerated street resurfacing, Gulfport Blvd. improvements, Waterfront redevelopments along the beach and Shore Blvd., our massive ongoing sewer rehabilitation and replacement, improvements to pedestrian / bike trails and travel, citywide LED lighting, storm water mitigation projects such as the Tangerine Greenway and the 49th St. Outfall project.

We've also been able to revamp every park and playground in the city and make better use of our open green spaces like the Clymer Park blocks and the Trolley Market Square project that is underway on the east end of the Tangerine Greenway. We have had so much success at securing outside funding for city projects in the last six years, largely due to the diligence and know-how of our department directors and City Manager.

Q: What would you like to do next?

I want to see our sewer system improvements through to completion if possible. That is vital to our city's future, and just good stewardship of our coastal environment. I want to see expansion and improvements to our senior center in the near future, and start incorporating solar technology into our city buildings. We need to find an ecologically sensitive way to re-nourish our city beach as well, and continue finding ways to mitigate harmful runoff from entering our waterways.

I want us to keep improving our roads, alleys and sidewalks and better connect us to local trail systems. This will also help improve parking in congested areas if we make it safer and easier for visitors to access Gulfport without a car. I want to continue doing all we can to keep our millage rates and utility rates manageable and equitable.

And perhaps most importantly, I want to keep streamlining and improving how I manage and facilitate our Council meetings. We have an obligation as a Council to give people a voice, to operate efficiently and effectively, and to conduct ourselves professionally, honestly and respectfully. That is one of my most important roles, and I learn better how to do it every time we convene.

Q: What can the people of Gulfport do to keep us moving forward?

We all need to do a better job at treating people with understanding, compassion and respect. It is hard to do, and particularly during such a politically and socially divisive time. We are all so different, but in spite of this we have so much in common.

We want to be successful, to be happy, to be healthy and to be free to live our lives the way we choose. If we start with what we have in common as opposed to that which separates us, it is much easier to see eye to eye and maintain a meaningful and productive dialogue.

This community thrives when we lend a hand instead of pointing fingers. Our diversity is actually our strength, and part of what makes Gulfport so unique.

Hello everyone, did you know that the police department will perform a security survey of your home or business absolutely FREE of charge?

The police department has several crime prevention practitioners who have gone through extensive training such as Residential Security Applications, Commercial Security Applications, Crime Prevention Through Environmental Design, and other types of training that have been certified by the state's Attorney General.

The officer (or detective) will come to your residence or business and give you suggestions on what can be done to improve the security of your property, whether it be through proper landscaping, lighting, perimeters, security cameras, etc. Officers will also give compliments on what you have that is sufficient as well.

The security survey typically takes approximately 30-45 minutes. If you do not feel comfortable with having an officer in your home, an "exterior only" survey can be completed as well. 
