


# Dedicated to:

I heard it on the telly, this morning on the news. My teachers, neighbours and the vet were talking COVID too.






They said it's spread across the world when people travel 'round, on cruises, buses, planes and trains, in shops and footy grounds.

So what's this thing called COVID? And what's it gonna do? It's sounding kind of scary and I don't have a clue.






But mum and dad are in the know and so they sit me down; they say it is a new disease - a germy virus with a crown.



Then I must wash my hands again and always keep them clean.




Mum says we need to stay at home where we are safe and sound, and keep away from busy spots where COVID can be found.

And if we are near other folk, we'll try to stay apart - two meters, say the doctors, is really very smart.






My school is closed and now online and I can't meet my friends. There's no more playing in the park until this crisis ends.
