| May 23 to May 27   | Paper Dowel Challenge – What will you make out of paper dowels?   |
| May 31 to June 3   | Cardboard Challenge – What can you build out of cardboard boxes? Every day will be a new challenge.   |
| June 6 to June 10  | Germ Imposter – How easy is it for germs to grow? How quickly will germs spread? Investigate who, how and why germs spread.   |
| June 13 to June 17 | Teacher/Student Challenge – The students will join the teachers in participating in a food challenge, color war, drawing on teachers' shirts and massive musical chairs. All leading up to Teacher Torture Day. |
| June 20 to June 24 | Art – Join us in a week of art projects. Pendulum painting, creating the longest piece of paper, spin art, paint walk and stamp art.  |
| June 27 to July 1  | Dominos Challenge – The children will use different supplies to create a domino creation. Each day will have different challenges.  |
| July 5 to July 8   | Science Experiments – Each day will have different experiments such as volcano, make your own bubble solution, bottle rockets, and create an ancient Greek architecture.  |
| July 11 to July 15 | Medieval Week – The children will make their own jousting stick and shield. They will compete in a jousting competition. They will also make their own mythical creature.                                       |
| July 18 to July 22 | Superhero Week – The children will create their own superpowers and name. They will also make a mask and be assigned a villain to defeat.   |
| July 25 to July 29 | Water Week – Each day will have different water activities. Such as ice blocks, ice cube painting, and shaving cream.   |
