# WISDOM OF ISRAEL: Job 38: 1-7, 34-41

One: Then the Lord answered Job out of the whirlwind: "Who is this that darkens counsel by words without knowledge? Gird up your loins like a man, I will question you, and you shall declare to me.

"Where were you when I laid the foundation of the earth? Tell me, if you have understanding. Who determined its measurements – surely you know! Or who stretched the line upon it? On what were its bases sunk, or who laid its cornerstone when the morning stars sang together and all the heavenly beings shouted for joy? "Can you lift up your voice to the clouds, so that a flood of waters may cover you? Can you send forth lightnings, so that they may go and say to you, 'Here we are'? Who has put wisdom in the inward parts, or given understanding to the mind? Who has the wisdom to number the clouds? Or who can tilt the waterskins of the heavens, when the dust runs into a mass and the clods cling together? "Can you hunt the prey for the lion, or satisfy the appetite of the young lions, when they crouch in their dens, or lie in wait in their covert? Who provides for the raven its prey, when its young ones cry to God, and wander about for lack of food?

GOSPEL: Mark 9:38-50

One: James and John, the sons of Zebedee, came forward to him and said to him, "Teacher, we want you to do for us whatever we ask of you." And he said to them, "What is it you want me to do for you?" And they said to him, "Grant us to sit, one at your right hand and one at your left, in your glory." But Jesus said to them, "You do not know what you are asking. Are you able to drink the cup that I drink, or be baptized with the baptism that I am baptized with?" They

replied, "We are able." Then Jesus said to them, "The cup that I drink you will drink; and with the baptism with which I am baptized, you will be baptized; but to sit at my right hand or at my left is not mine to grant, but it is for those for whom it has been prepared."

When the ten heard this, they began to be angry with James and John. So Jesus called them and said to them, "You know that among the Gentiles those whom they recognize as their rulers lord it over them, and their great ones are tyrants over them. But it is not so among you; but whoever wishes to become great among you must be your servant, and whoever wishes to be first among you must be slave of all. For the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and to give his life a ransom for many."

One: The Gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ

All: Praise to you, O Christ!

REFLECTION: Why Me, Lord! - Job 38: 1-7 and 34-41 I love a wide variety of music, but deep down in my roots, I have always been a Country and Western fan. I like Kris Kristofferson, but appreciate his composition more than his gravelly voice. He wrote "Why Me Lord," the words of which appealed and spoke to me.

Why me Lord, what have I ever done – wouldn't you expect this to continue with – to have deserved such bad treatment – but that is not the case. He continues with:

To deserve even one of the pleasures I've known Tell me Lord, what did I ever do That was worth loving you For the kindness you've shown. Lord help me Jesus, I've wasted it so Help me Jesus I know what I am Now that I know that I've needed you so Help me Jesus, my souls in your hand.

Tell me Lord, if you think there's a way I can try to repay All I've taken from you.

Maybe Lord, I can show someone else

What I've been through myself On my way back to you.

Chorus..

So, my reading of Job, his troubles and misfortunes brings me back to the words of this song. No matter what happens to Job, he comes back to the solid rock of his Lord. He counts his blessings, not his losses. Yet, he does not hesitate to question God as to "Why?" He is conflicted, having received blessings on one hand that he knows he hasn't deserved, and on the other hand, the devastating losses, which he also knows he hasn't deserved. So, God, "Why?"

Have you ever found yourself asking "Why?" When the avalanche is crashing over you and your despair is rising. There are so many ways in which life can get your down, make you feel trapped, afraid, unsure of which way to turn. It can seem like there is no way out. You know that you have been blessed, but it seems to be fading, and the darkness is closing in. Money worries, marriage falling apart, children straying on the wrong side of life, a loved one diagnosed with a terminal illness, a death of someone you don't want to let go, a new discovery of an alternate identity in sexual awareness. These, and more topple

your equilibrium and shake your comfort level, leading you to ask – Where is God, and Why is this happening to me?

God finally breaks through from the center of a catastrophic storm to speak directly to Job. His reply never deals with the "Why?" In essence, he says Why is not the right question because there is no possible comprehension of the magnitude of God's immense creation. He throws out question after question to Job. "Where were you when I set the heavens in place?" When all was aligned and calculated out precisely down to the finest minute detail. Do you even have any idea of the brilliance that surrounds us? We see a similar method of response in many of the stories of Jesus. He never directly answers questions either. Instead, he fires back question after question. It is a method calculated to make you think and work out the answers for yourself, not to provide ready-made answers handed out to you. I see these as teaching moments that are designed to expand our awareness.

Some things we have to take as a "given." We are surrounded by both good and bad. And we never know from one day to the next what will befall. I think of the major accidents that occur without warning. One leaves their home in the morning expecting a normal day, and does not return to their family at night fall. A sewer grate opens up on the roadway and a child on a tricycle falls through. Freak accidents claim lives and change, in an instant, the family left behind.

The God portrayed in the beginning of the Job story is a manufactured picture of God. God does not pull strings, nor hurl thunderbolts of misfortune against us. God is not complicit in arranging our downfall or punishing us for our mistakes. God has created with imagination, intelligence and wisdom a place for

us to live in harmony with the rest of God's creation. It has both idyllic gardens and pits of barbed wire. Our lives consist of joy and sorrow, moments of elation, and moments of defeat. We look to the pinnacle of God's creation, a land for all peoples, plants and animals to co-exist together, helping, and encouraging, each other but often human greed and fear get in the way.

"Why" is a useless quest; some things just are, as they are meant to be. They are beyond our understanding. Do we presume to tell God that what God is doing is wrong? God runs the universe and all that is in it. We are but specks, yet the miracle is that God loves even the smallest sparrows and God loves us immensely, cares for us and watches over us like a protective mother. Even the most protective parent cannot prevent bad things from happening to their offspring. They can only sit back and watch and hope, and wait.

There are consequences to our choices; some have obvious outcomes; even not doing something, or not taking an action is a choice. Sometimes we are surprised to learn that continuing to follow the same pattern will not produce new results. When we fall victim to an aggressive illness, or find ourselves at the mercy of a devastating loss, there is no answer as to "why." There are no black clouds hovering, waiting to deal out bad luck. We are not being manipulated by a malevolent force that likes to watch us squirm. We are overseen by a loving God who comforts and walks with us.

I believe that some of our ideas that we attribute to God needs to change. Do we need to have a God that is all-powerful, all-knowing, all-present, and all-good? Have we placed too much of our human expectations on our Deity? When bad things happen

and we think that they should have been under the control of God, but God didn't do anything to change them, we become disillusioned and angry. Perhaps, God has created in such a way that some things are outside God's control to change.

When there appears to be a miraculous intervention that is outside the realm of explainable in rescuing and saving lives, is that a personal, specific action by God, or is all part of the unexplainable "why" of the Universe.

Why me, Lord? What have I ever done?

You have blessed me beyond my wildest expectations.

You have given me life to experience and enjoy.

You have placed me in a loving family with good friends surrounding me.

You have given me a roof over my head and food on my table. You have taught me to love and care for others and I am grateful for all that I am and all that I have.

Why me, Lord? If we feel the need to ask "why" then let it be through Kristofferson's perspective on life. Amen.
