
In the four verses before our passage reading for today, we learn that the angel and the pillar of cloud that had been leading the Israelite army, changed position, from the front to the rear of the advancement, once they reached the shores of the Red Sea. Moses, alone is now in the lead with the full empowerment of God.

From the flank, God is able to protect the fleeing people by positioning Godself in between the Egyptians and Israelites. Moses with outstretched staff, both commands the sea to split to allow dry land for their escape, and then closure, to ensnare their followers. It is a dramatic, miraculous scene, of delivery and at the same time, devastation.


To the Jewish people, God is their hero and saviour; to the Egyptians, God is their villain and punisher. Incredible power unleashed; something which I can neither condone, justify, or criticize, for it is beyond my understanding.

Matthew's scripture sets up our model for forgiveness. It especially relates to those who recognize and ask for forgiveness, and reminds us that God is the one who forgives us unconditionally throughout our lives, with no limitation, as many times as it takes.

The example of the one who throws themselves on God's mercy for an extremely large debt, reminds us that all of us are in God's debt for our very lives. Having been the recipient of such mercy, how could we not go out and do likewise with those who owe us. Forgiveness has no



bounds. One does not condone the behaviour, or become weak by forgiving it; one is freed from its bitterness.


