Please share a brief biography and personal background:

I have filled many roles in my life so far, including an attorney, a mom, an activist, an educator's wife, a Novi City Councilmember, and a Michigan State Representative. I am a mom of two (Abigal 11, and Elliot 8). My husband Matt and I live in Novi.

As a native Michigander, my love for our state was built on a deep sense of admiration and pride in my neighbors and our community. That's why I entered public service in the first place. When my neighbors and I joined together to push back against an irresponsible local development project, we



were able to make an important change in our neighborhood. From that point on, I was sold on the idea of spending my days making life better for people in my community.

During my time as a state representative, I have worked on two major initiatives: Childcare Taskforce and the School Safety Task Force. Both of these initiatives will continue to be priorities - keeping our children and schools safe, reducing gun violence and providing support to children and families. I will also continue to work on supporting critical infrastructure improvements that will reduce harm on our environment and providing safe water to drink and enjoy recreationally. Finally, I will have a focus on increasing access to healthcare for our residents. Any discussion of health care must realize the inseparable role of mental health in maintaining overall health. As a member of the School Safety Task Force, I'm also working to boost resources for students to ensure that caring for our mental health is a habit that starts early.

My time on council, i worked to ensure the Novi Master Plan offered flexibility. I believe local governments need to ensure Master Plans are able to handle upcoming transportation initiatives to include mass transit, Elective Vehicles and driverless tech. This area is a hub for EV and Driverless technology and we need to make our Master Plans ready to adapt with charging stations, local ordinance updates, etc.
