The average **Persistence Success Score** for Public HBCUs (A) was 95 while the score for Private HBCUs (B) was 104. Let's dig down. If one analyzed our **Persistence Success Score** based on, for example, the *Payscale 2019-2020 College Salary Report* (<https://www.payscale.com/college-roi>) for the top 35 institutions in the country, the mean **Persistence Success Score** was 183; The minimum score was 146 while the maximum was 197. Would you like to work toward the 150 or the 183 score? This information is available to parents and students in dashboards. How you train, retain, and graduate students is much clearer to the public now. We have seen significant statistical and pragmatic (i.e. average salary at graduation, early-career salary potential, and mid-career salary potential) differences based on a median-split and/or quartile analysis using the **Persistence Success Score** as an independent variable. It is also important to look at your four-year graduation rates and work to improve them.
