




JOE'S PRESIDENTIAL MESSAGE




This month our very own Tom Bridges will be presenting to the club on how to Breed discus. I am looking forward to hearing this presentation and learning about discus.

From the Editor's Desk – Lee Routhier

I hope everyone had a Merry Christmas, and Happy New Year. All the best for you and your families in 2015. What will the new year bring you? My goal this year is to do a large aquarium approx 100 gallons, with a canister filter. For some of you that may seem low key. But for me it's a challenge. I have worked with canisters before but never really liked them as I find them heavy, bulky and leak. I have found a new product on the market which I thought I would give a shot. Will give you my thoughts on it further into the year. We are a little short on items for this news letter, there are no photos from the last meeting. You will notice that I have improvised as best as I can. .

Hornwort

Ceratophyllum demersum, more widely known by its common name Hornwort, is a floating plant that became popular among aquarium hobbyists due to its hardiness and attractiveness. It is a truly floating plant, as it does not produce any roots when planted. Usually, aquarists let this plant float freely in tanks to provide excellent cover for fish fry. Hornwort can also be attached to the ground to grow as an upright stem plant. For example, photo 1 shows Hornwort attached with a veggie clip to the bottom of my 33 gallon tank.

Given bright light, Hornwort grows fast. Its rapid growth rate helps control nitrates in the tank and deprive algae from nutrients. According to Fohrman (2000, p.181), Hornwort can reach the maximum height of 100 cm. Indeed, in my 33 gallon tank, Hornwort routinely grows above 50 cm in length, as shown in photo 2. Hornwort is easy to propagate by cutting, and any sizable piece or a side shoot will grow into a new plant. If left without trimming in a small tank, Hornwort becomes a thick mass of twisted vegetation. For instance, photo 3 shows how Hornwort has grown in my 6 gallon tank.

Some aquarists complain that Hornwort breaks easily and its small pieces clog filters. However, I did not have this problem as long as the plant was provided with bright light. Without sufficient light Hornwort stops growing and slowly disintegrates.

Hornwort does not have a specific place of origin, and it can survive at relatively low temperatures. For example, both Fohrman (2000, p.181) and Hiscock (2001, p.68) show a temperature range of 10-28 degrees of Centigrade for Hornwort. All my tanks are kept at least at 22 degrees, so I did not have an opportunity to observe Hornwort at lower temperatures. However, aquarists looking for a plant for their cold water fish tanks may be interested in Hornwort. Overall, Hornwort is a hardy and beautiful plant that grows well under different water conditions.




