Dream vacation spot: Anywhere with mountains, heavy snow, and light traffic.

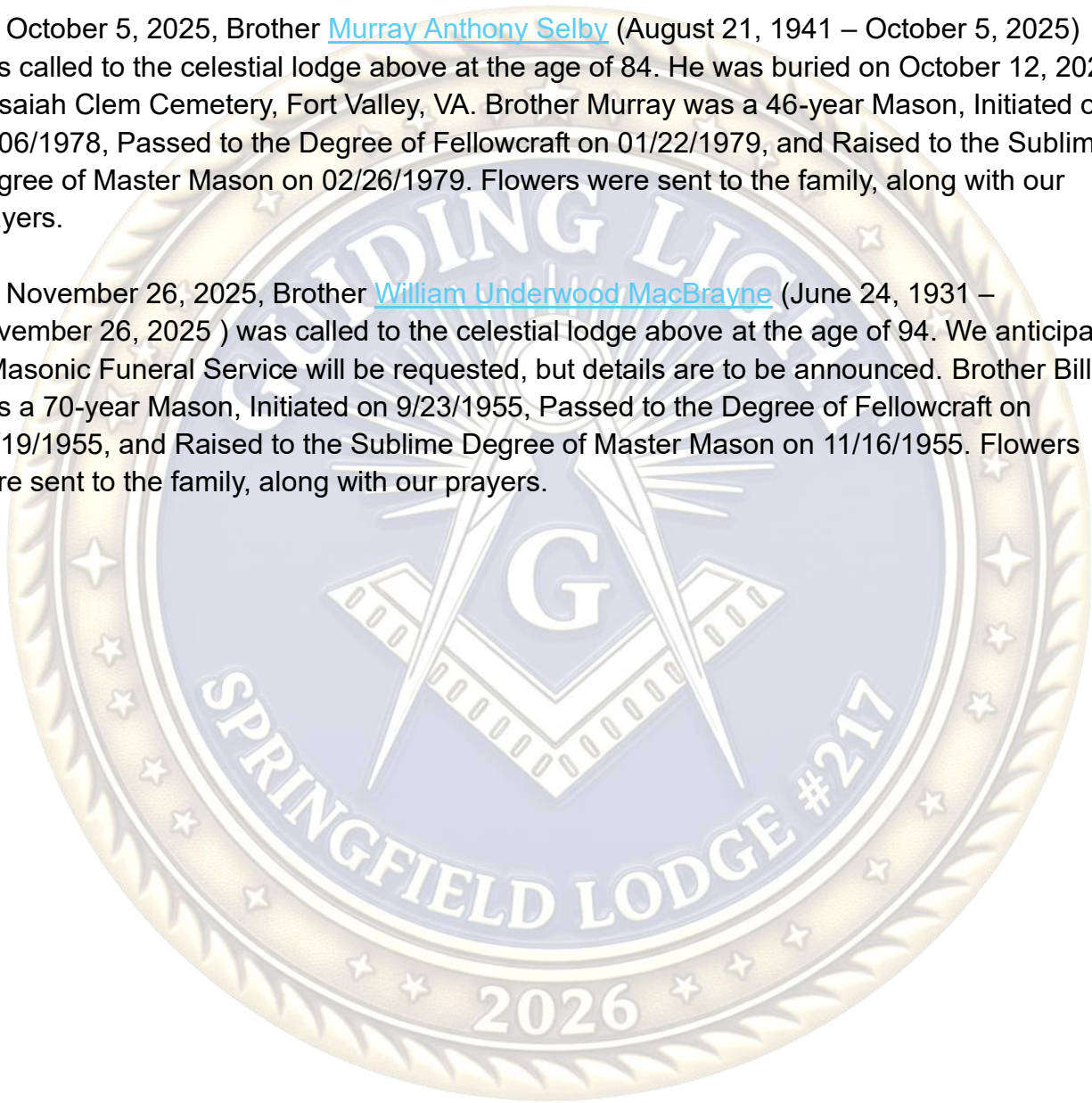


SUNSHINE AND COMMITTEE REPORTS
