Mr. Stewart called the regular Board meeting of the Central Ohio Joint Fire District to order at 7:00p.m.

## **SWEARING IN OF FIREFIGHTERS**

Firefighters, Hayden Normann and Daniel Ellinger were sworn in.

### **APPROVAL OF MINUTES**

Mr. Dickerson moved to approve the minutes from the regular meeting on September 19, 2024, and Mr. Cochran seconded the motion. In the affirmative: Mr. Cochran, Mr. Dickerson and Mr. Stewart. In the negative: None.

#### **REPORTS**

Chief McCann Report – (Attached)

If the board decides to contract with RecoveryUSA, they would be billing insurance companies, not the residents. All insurance companies would get the bill whether or not they live out of the district, and all the residents would need to do is give the name of their insurance. The Board will review all documents before deciding at the next meeting.

Chief McCann, FPO Farmer, and the Board reviewed the Ohio Fire Code's Appendices, with feedback provided from Captain Burnes, Lt. Andrian and Lt. Alfrey provided in the Chief's report and determined which Appendices would be adopted after receiving the resolution from the Prosecutor. To Adopt: *Appendices B, C, D, E, F, G, H, I, J, N* 

Not to Adopt: *Appendices A, K, L, M* 

For any of the Appendices that would be adopted, there would be means and process to adjudicate against it if the owner felt it necessary.

Discussion on the Central Ohio District Hydrant Program ensued. Chief McCann clarified that the District's program requires less than the Ohio Fire Code. For instance, standard for a developed lot is 300 ft between hydrants, while the District's program allows 400 ft. Zoning determines whether a lot is commercial or residential. Chief McCann further clarified that if it is an existing road, the District is responsible for installing the hydrants, which it currently budgets 10K for annually. If it is a new road, the developer would be responsible for the installation cost.

Mr. Dickerson moved the adoption of the following resolution:

## RESOLUTION 10.16.2024.01

# A RESOLUTION ADOPTING CENTRAL OHIO JOINT FIRE DISTRICT'S HYDRANT PROGRAM, ESTABLISHED ON AUGUST 30, 2021

Whereas, RURAL ROADS, identified as Residential or Commercial Lots not within a village or roads not being developed by a commercial developer, hydrant spacing should be 800 ft. apart. Topography, lack of development, lack of easement acquisition, and lack of funding would allow for variances; and

Whereas, URBAN STREETS OR COMMERCIAL LOTS within a village/city limit or being developed by a commercial developer would require a 400 ft hydrant placing and plan approval. Exception would be remanufacturing, or commercial development that may require closer spacing; and

Whereas, HYDRANT SPECIFICATION would meet Delco specifications for installation and would have 5"STORZ fitting and two, 2.5" outlets, approved by Delco and reviewed annually;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Central Ohio Joint Fire District Board hereby adopts the hydrant program attached hereto as Exhibit A; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that it is hereby found and determined that all formal actions of this Board concerning and relating to this Resolution were in compliance with O.R.C. 121.22.

Mr. Cochran seconded the resolution and the roll being called upon its adoption the vote resulted as follows:

On Chief McCann's recommendation, Mr. Stewart moved to hire Part-Time EMT/FF John Baldinelli @ \$17.00 per hour, and Mr. Cochran seconded the motion. In the affirmative: Mr. Cochran, Mr. Dickerson and Mr. Stewart. In the negative: None.
