November Devotion - "Names"

Romans 10:13, "Everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved." In Tongan culture, one way we remember people who were dear to us in our life's journey is by naming our children after them. Names have a value in the *taufatungamotu'a* (culture) because they keep the ancestral presence alive within a person and the family. My name, "Latu," means "which direction to sail," derived from the original Fijian name of "Ratu." My father named me after a Tongan Wesleyan pastor who became a father figure to him during his adolescent years.

Furthermore, as I inherited the name from birth, my mother told me she wanted to name me after her adoptive father, who was a long-time choir director at their local church in Tonga. I always argued with my parents as a teenager, telling them that I can't be like the original "latu" because I'm me. My father would often remind me to abstain from alcohol and drugs to align myself with the person I am named after.

When I visit relatives overseas, I notice that my name brings a sense of peace to my aunts and uncles. They call for me in their homes, during celebrations, or announce my name in public because it holds a special place in my family's heart. This month, for the first Sunday of November, we remember the saints who played a key role in our walk with God. We posted the special names of those who loved, cared for, and accepted our well-being because we were valuable to them.

Who are the names that are special to you, my church family? How do you honor these special names in your daily life? This reflection leads us to the book of Romans, where Paul explains that those who call on the name of the Lord will be saved. The name Jesus is the truth, the way, and the light to be in relationship with God. What names will you remember this month that brought you closer to God in Jesus Christ?

Let us pray: Dear Lord, we remember the names of saints who were a guide in the walk of faith with You. We pray that you keep the name of Jesus within our hearts to honor the names who brought us closer to you. In Jesus Christ we pray, Amen.

You can start reading for the 2026 United in Women in Faith Reading program. To complete the program read at least one book from each of the five categories: Education for Mission Category, Leadership Development, Nurturing for Community, Social Action and Spiritual Growth. You can read any of the new books or any of the books from the last 4 years in our church library.

The Making of Biblical Womanhood by Beth Allison Barr

Beth Barr challenges the long-held belief that the idea that women should be submissive, quiet, and domestic – is divinely ordained. Drawing on her background as a medieval historian and her own experiences in evangelical Christianity, Barr argues that these gender roles are not rooted in Scripture but in historical and cultural traditions shaped by patriarch.

The book combines personal storytelling with solid historical research, tracing how interpretations of the Bible have been influenced by social structures rather than divine command. Barr's writing is clear, passionate, and accessible, making complex ideas understandable to general readers.

This a thought-provoking, faith-affirming work that invites readers – especially those in Christian communities to re-examine how history and theology have shaped women's roles in the church and home. It's both scholarly and deeply personal, offering hope for a more equal and faithful future.

Pack a Shoebox Gift for a Child in Need



Operation Christmas Child (OCC) was the brainchild of a Welsh couple, Jill and David Cooke. They started sending gifts and supplies in shoeboxes to children in Romanian orphanages in 1990. Three years later this project merged with Samaritan's Purse. Shoeboxes are now shipped to children in over 170 countries and territories as tangible evidence of God's love for them.

Last year UWF got involved in packing & sending boxes, and we're excited to get the information to all church members this year!

Please consider stuffing an empty shoebox from the narthex! Each box has a brochure with instructions for filling the box and a label for the outside of the box (to indicate the gender and age of the recipient). There is a QR code in the brochure (takes you to the website samaritanspurse.org/occ) with a lot more suggestions for gifts and an expanded list of "nonos." Please remove all packaging from items as much as is possible (batteries must be in the original packaging, but some of the cardboard could be removed).

Boxes can be returned to Linda Miner or Nancy Deis; or brought to the UWF luncheon on November 13th or dropped in the wicker chest next to the tree in the library. Final date to get the shoeboxes to CVUMC is November 23rd. High Sierra Fellowship will have last-minute drop off times on November 24th.



Join us following each of the performances in the fellowship hall for treats and refreshments.



This month, we are observing the worship theme titled "The Days Are Surely Coming."
