Book Report by Linda Malconian

The Sun Does Shine is the true story of Anthony Ray Hinton, a man who was wrongfully convicted of murder in Alabama and spent nearly 30 years on death row before being proven innocent. Hinton describes the injustice he faced, including racism, poor legal representation, and a flawed justice system that refused to listen to the truth. Despite his suffering, he never gave up hope.

With the support of his mother, his best friend Lester, and later lawyer Bryan Stevenson from the Equal Justice Initiative, Hinton kept his faith in God and found strength to forgive those who wronged him. The book is not just about his personal struggle but also a powerful reminder of how unfair the criminal justice system can be. The book shows the importance of hope, faith, forgiveness, and fighting for justice.

Faith and Love in Jesus

2 *Timothy* 1:13

Hold to the standard of sound teaching that you have heard from me, in the faith and love that are in Christ Jesus

In January 2019, I attended my first semester at the Pacific School of Religion seminary in Berkeley, enrolled in the Master of Divinity program. I was new to the progressive theology taught in many of the classes I attended, but I was also challenged to unlearn some of the calcified narratives instilled in me as a child.


Despite my upbringing in San Francisco, where certain family members warned me to avoid a specific group of people labeled as "sinful" and "disgusting," my experience at PSR challenged these notions. As I adjusted to campus life and progressive theology, I discovered that my dorm neighbors—who matched the group I was taught to avoid—were among the most supportive people I met as a student..

I made a very difficult decision as a PSR student. I got to know them very well. I shared food, coffee, and participated in study groups, as well as enjoyed early morning breakfasts before class during my three-year study. I learned to unlearn the hate towards other people who were different from me. I also learned to revisit the love of Christ for the outcast or for people who were seen as disgusting and sinful.

Timothy teaches us that if we are to be Christlike, it must be a standard in how we apply ourselves in a complex world. The gospels record specifically of Jesus interacting with tax collectors, sinners, and unclean people. Jesus advocating and interacting with the outcasts of his community became part of his new community.

This is what we are called to do as Christians: to love the world as God has made it and to transform it through the grace of Christ with love and mercy. Even though we may have differing opinions or beliefs, the love of Christ brings us to a common place of holy ground. Our differences should not be the substance that divides us as human beings; it is a tool to work together in unity as God's people. May you be called to show faith and love as Christ exemplified in His ministry on earth.

With this month's worship series, titled "Choosing Faith," will be making our way back to the gospel readings for the remainder of the year. We are observing the stories of Jesus from his teachings, preachings, and healings in the gospel of Luke to prepare our journey towards the Advent season. We have many things to celebrate in the month of October because we have experienced a surplus of events in our church community that have strengthened our fellowship as siblings, and strengthened our knowledge of God's Word in our bible studies.

As we look at our journey as United Methodists over the last nine months, we are convinced that faith is the substance that has kept us in community. Former Methodist Bishop Francis Asbury defined faith as a "prayer-hearing, soul-converting, soul-sanctifying, soul-restoring, soul-comforting God." As United Methodists, we uphold the sacred practices of worship, the Word, and service as testimony to our faith. We share the message of faith in diverse ways through our outreach and global ministries.

Faith is not limited by gender, age, ethnicity, or sexuality. It is a substance connected to God working within us, or a personal response to God's grace through Jesus Christ. On our journey as God's people, we encounter a complex range of experiences. Life can test our sanity and hinder our relationship with God with fear, trauma, and ungodly behaviors. In our nation today, we face one of the highest levels of unwanted violence on school campuses and in public areas. As Christians, we look beyond our understanding to a greater source for relief.

However, Jesus tells us in the Gospel of Luke that we must have a humble faith, creating space for God to guide us into prosperity. Theologian Karl Barth reminds us to rely on the Holy Spirit to overcome the world's injustices and wickedness. Faith is a transformative substance, capable of bringing change to even the darkest places, as exemplified by Jesus Christ's response to cruelty during his time.

As we continue to follow Jesus, thrive in community, and heal the world, may we be reminded that faith in Christ alone is the substance of fulfilling our mission to the community and the world.
