Greetings once again from your friendly music director, Tammy Owens. By the time you are reading this the choir and the bell choirs will be enjoying a well deserved break. They work very hard for nine months preparing music for each service. They are very dedicated to learning the music which often requires them to practice at home in addition to our weekly rehearsals.

Here is a summary of their season this year. The Sierra Ringers and the Campane Ringers performed 22 pieces this year. They played for both services twice a month. They also performed two one hour long concerts and played for the Volante assisted living center once. The Chancel Choir performed 46 songs this year with 16 of them being brand new. They too did an evening concert sharing the Christmas Cantata. In addition, several of our choir members have performed solos throughout the year and some will also sing solos during the summer.

That's a lot of music by anyone's standards. I know that you miss hearing them during the summer but they truly need this time to recharge. They will start rehearsing again the last week of August so that they may continue to serve you.

Adult Confirmation Class

As we continue to be in community as God's living body of Christ here in Carson Valley United Methodist Church, we are also approaching an important event on the calendar – our California Nevada Annual Conference in Sacramento, California. The conference brings all our church districts together to have a conversation about our mission as the visible body of Christ in this world.

After my endeavors at the Annual Conference, I will be holding a six week adult confirmation class titled: Thriving in Community, which will be concentrated on United Methodist Church teachings and history. This four-week confirmation class will cover the history of the Wesleyan heritage, church polity and missions, sacraments, grace and the holy trinity, salvation and free will, and the Wesleyan quadrilateral.

2024 UWF Reading Program

Thanks to the United Women in Faith our church has a regular reading program. You can browse all the books in the 2025 program at https://bookshop.org/shop/uwfaith Our local UWF groups will be purchasing several books, plus ones in our local Douglas Co. Library. Men and women of the church are encouraged to read at least one book from each of the five categories: Education for Mission, Leadership, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, and Spiritual Growth. Books from the current year & 4 previous years are also eligible. This year's program ended in August, but you can start reading for next year's program with any of the books from recent years in our church library.

One of the new books is *The Power of Together* by Jim Putman. This book explores how building relationships within the church can strengthen and deepen our own Christian faith.

People are meant to be in families and groups that care for, love, and listen to one another. The author gives examples of how being part of a spiritual family helps individuals navigate the challenges in their lives. He describes how families love each other no matter what, can prevent problems and be restorative. Sometimes we think we can just make it alone without any help or support. Even Jesus brought diverse people close to him and his ministry. He loves them even when they weren't lovable.

This book looks at the importance of "doing life" in close fellowship with other believers bringing you closer to others and to Jesus.

Inquiring Minds Want to Know: What is Farkle?



A special thanks to Nancy Deis for her support of our Youth Group.






Calling All Cookie Bakers!
