2024 UWF Reading Program

One of the UWF Reading Program books is They Called Us Enemy by George Takei, Eisinger Scott Becker

Susan Hanley says, "This book was a real eye opener and memoir as to what went on in 10 American concentration camps after Pearl Harbor was bombed by the Japanese. Over 120,000 Japanese Americans were imprisoned by the US government during WWII."

George Takei's memoir reveals the lessons learned beginning at four years old finding his birth country at war with Japan after the attack. In 1942 Franklin Roosevelt ordered every person of Japanese descent on the west coast to be shipped to relocation centers thousands of miles from home to be held for years under armed guards. George's family of faith in God helped them through the years of hardship behind wire fences and poor living conditions.


This is a true story of a brave Japanese/ American family laid out in cartoons so young children as well as adults can learn this history.


At the end of George's story he finds an astonishing future. It is in our church library and can also be borrowed from our Douglas County Library.

Each year the United Women in Faith offer a reading program. Men and women of the church are encouraged to read at least one book from each of the five categories: Education for Mission, Leadership, Nurturing for Community, Social Action, and Spiritual Growth. Books from the current year and four previous years are also eligible.

Praise be to God that we have journeyed through the first half of 2024, and now arrive in July where we will celebrate our country's Independence Day. As happy as we are as a church, I wanted to share a praise with you all that I have been reappointed here to the Carson Valley United Methodist Church. My family and I enjoy every moment as your pastor leading our church community in the light of Jesus Christ and His teachings. God has worked in our local church community and changed many people's lives with our ministry, worship, and the extensions of our outreach. Our church continues to carry out many ways of preaching the Word of God through Jesus Christ in our gifts and talents.

For July let us lift our church in worship. When we worship Jesus Christ as one people, the Bible tells us that we are undivided. Christ has taken it to the cross to eliminate any hostility that would prevent anyone from drawing close to him.

Our worship reminds us that we were once separated -- as Paul would refer to "Jews or Gentiles." In the church's history we have endured racial segregation in different parts of our conference. Today, we worship as the body of Christ throughout major parts of the world, cultures, languages, and communities. John Wesley reminds us, "The world is my parish." He meant that the gospel of Christ is for all people who are called by God's grace.

Every aspect of our worship service reminds us of our Methodist heritage--implementing the presence of the Holy Spirit within our church community. Our song of gathering, the invitational prayer, the prayers and praises, and the children's message, even the choir's anthem all play a pivotal role in reminding us that we are one with one another, one as a church, and one with God.

My sermons in July will talk of our weaknesses and strengths in the presence of God. For seven weeks, July 14 to Aug. 18, we will look at important parts of worship that include our worship as God's people, confession, call to worship and our prayers as a church.

We have plans for a Bible-study in mid-summer. We also plan for faith formation sessions before the year ends.

I hope you all have a blessed July full of worship, prayer, and acts of mercy to our community and beyond. Let it be known in your reading of scripture, reason, experience and carrying our traditions as Methodists that we must continue to Follow Jesus, Thrive in Community, and Heal the World.
