## Prayer Tree


God answers prayers, everyone needs a prayer said for them. A prayer of praise, a prayer of need or a prayer for comfort.


There is a prayer tree in the back of the sanctuary with several names and

### **Perfectly Imperfect**

"Don't fall backwards!" An entirely appropriate warning came from somewhere in the peanut gallery as I tried to photograph a giant redwood tree using the *panorama* mode on my camera. By the time I had the top of the tree in view, my back was arched like an Olympic gymnast on a balance beam as I aimed the camera straight up into the air.

"Got it—the perfect redwood," I bragged as I showed off my trophy to my companions, whether interested or not. Indeed, it was a perfectly shaped tree. It had great form at the trunk and rose majestically into the sky, straight as an arrow. The more I looked at the photo, I realized something else—it was boring.

Thus began my quest for the perfectly imperfect tree. I finally found it, rising from a mangled trunk that seemed as if two trees had grown together. They were twins forced together, torsos reaching to the clouds. One side appeared to be broken off toward the top, allowing the other to win the skyward race. A flawless tree? Not at all. But for some reason it is so much better than the other. It tells a story....

What about us—should we be perfect, or at least look that way? Do you know that the word translated as "perfect" occurs only 19 times (it varies by translation) in the Old Testament. Nearly every one of those words refers to God—the perfect One. That certainly seems appropriate for God, but what about us? Surprisingly, the New Testament contains a word translated as "perfect" an amazing 30 times even though the New Testament is only about a fourth of the volume of the Old. Even more amazing, most of those words apply to us.

Jesus tells us, "Be perfect, as your Father in Heaven is perfect," (Matthew 5:48). And so, we strive for perfection.... Moral blamelessness is often our goal, but usually the best we can achieve is an outward beauty—sort of like the perfect redwood I initially photographed. I don't think that is what Jesus wants. Rather than a culturally defined, stereotypical moral conformity, I think we are at our best when we are like the second tree I captured—perfectly imperfect; pushed together by forces beyond our control; heaven-bound; striving and supporting each other until....

The apostle Paul described our imperfection and how it can be made perfect. In his second letter to the church in Corinth, Paul describes how he has asked Jesus to relieve him of a "thorn in his flesh," (see 2Cor 12:1-10). Was he describing some physical defect? Many scholars believe so. But I think not. Rather I believe that it was a spiritual failing—something manifested in the "flesh" that Paul could not overcome. It was something unseen—a private concern between Jesus and Paul—otherwise Paul would have told us what it was.


Here is the good part: Jesus tells Paul, and all of us, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness." Paul was perfectly imperfect...and so are we, through the grace of Jesus. May our perfect imperfection, empowered by Jesus, guide us through our days as we, heavenbound, strive together....

The mission of the Alpine Kids' Ministry is to prevent child abuse and neglect, and domestic violence while strengthening families and communities through play.


