You need not be a member of Carson Valley United Methodist Church (CVUMC) or any other church to participate in the Alpine Kids' Ministry. There are monthly family outings as well as monthly young adult outings. Cost is \$40 per household per year (\$5 a month payment accepted). FAMILY OUTINGS: Alpine Kids pays for the cost of admission for all activities, most of the food cost for all members attending, and some transportation costs on an individual basis.

<u>Sunday, June 29th:</u> Aces' Baseball Game. The only food vouchers there are for a hot dog and soda. Everyone will get a food voucher. If you have dietary needs, you can bring your own food, but it must be in a clear plastic bag or backpack. They do not take cash at any of the food booths. If you do not have plastic, you can go to the merchandise store and exchange cash for a gift card to use. Purses cannot be more than 4.5"x6.5". Anything larger must be in a clear plastic bag/backpack. Garage parking is \$17. The game starts at 1. Need to be inside by 12:30.

<u>Saturday</u>, <u>July 12th</u>: Carson Valley Cinema for the 12:30 shows. Movies that are confirmed "Jurassic World", Superman, Elio, and F1. Senior Citizens you will be able to choose from the other movies that will be showing except R-rated ones. The theater will be open to the public at 12:30 so we are not the only ones in the theater. Our members will receive a medium soda, and a medium popcorn.

The cost is \$3 for those 60 and above. \$7 for those under 60. Skip and I have eaten there, the food is good, and you get plenty to eat. On Thursdays, they have ice cream. You get to eat it before you eat lunch. They start serving ice cream around 9:30 - until they run out.
