#### 3143 Progress Reports

- Tree on Manor Road -still no information has been received from City Council. It was suggested that a tree should be planted anyway.
- Still no response has been received from Lancashire County Council about the highway sign on the foreshore which was knocked down
- Damage to dog waste bin on recreation field reported to City Council -still no response
- Damage to the canal bridge on Hatlex Lane- reported to Canal & River Trust, the damage has been inspected but any work is unlikely in the near future due to financial constraints
- Information has been received from the Slyne with Hest Football Club about the change of architect for their planning application for development of the club house and car park.
- Improvement of the planters; Mr Stuart Brade, groundsman, has done some work on them. Information has been obtained about the possible source of plants and planting is to be carried out
- Following the Electoral Review of Lancaster City Council, the Local Government Boundary Commission has publishedfinal recommendationssetting outnew electoral arrangements and this includes Slyne with Hest -noted
- Land on Hanging Green Lane with planning permission for development- enquiries have been made with Lancaster City Council Planning Department and while most of the conditions of the application have been discharged the issue of drainage has yet to be resolved.

#### 3147 Financial Matters

Approval was given to the monthly summary of receipts and payments.

Current Account £236,548 which includes the precept for 2022/23 and reserves for the developments at

the recreation field.

Bowling Club rent arrears; a message is to be sent reminding the secretary and treasurer that the rent of

£500 due on 1st April 2022 has not yet been paid and asking them to give it their urgent attention. There

has been discussions about the increase in the rent and an offer of seeking arbitration was made but no

response has been received.

#### 3148 Open Spaces

Erection of fence along the path by the pond on the recreation field-a quotation for the work has been

received and this includes some additional work that was discussed with the contractor to improve the

surface of the adjoining path. Approval was given to the acceptance of this quotation and for work to be

carried out.

Recreation Field; an application has been made to Lancaster City Council for the discharge of condition on

the application 21/00408/FUL for the MUGA, however Lancaster City Council requested more details on

the conditions relating to hard and soft landscaping. Contact is to be made with City Council to ask if

these latter conditions could be held over until the main work is completed so that work on the lighting

and construction of the MUGA can commence as soon as possible.

An application for work on recreation field trees covered by a TPO has been submitted to Lancaster City

Council and the outcome is awaited.

Consideration of the safety of the path which was damaged when the oak tree fell; the gate to the path

has been locked for safety but it is reported that in spite of warning notices people are climbing the gate

and fence to gain access. As the path has stabilised it was decided to open up the gate but to erect signs

warning of the uneveness of the path and the need to take care.

Safety of the memorials; enquiries have been made about the inspection of the memorials and the work

that may be required on some of them for safety -this is to be followed up.
