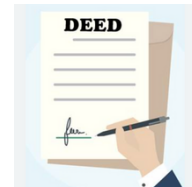


RISK REDUCTION

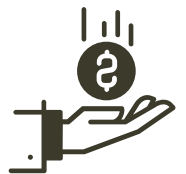

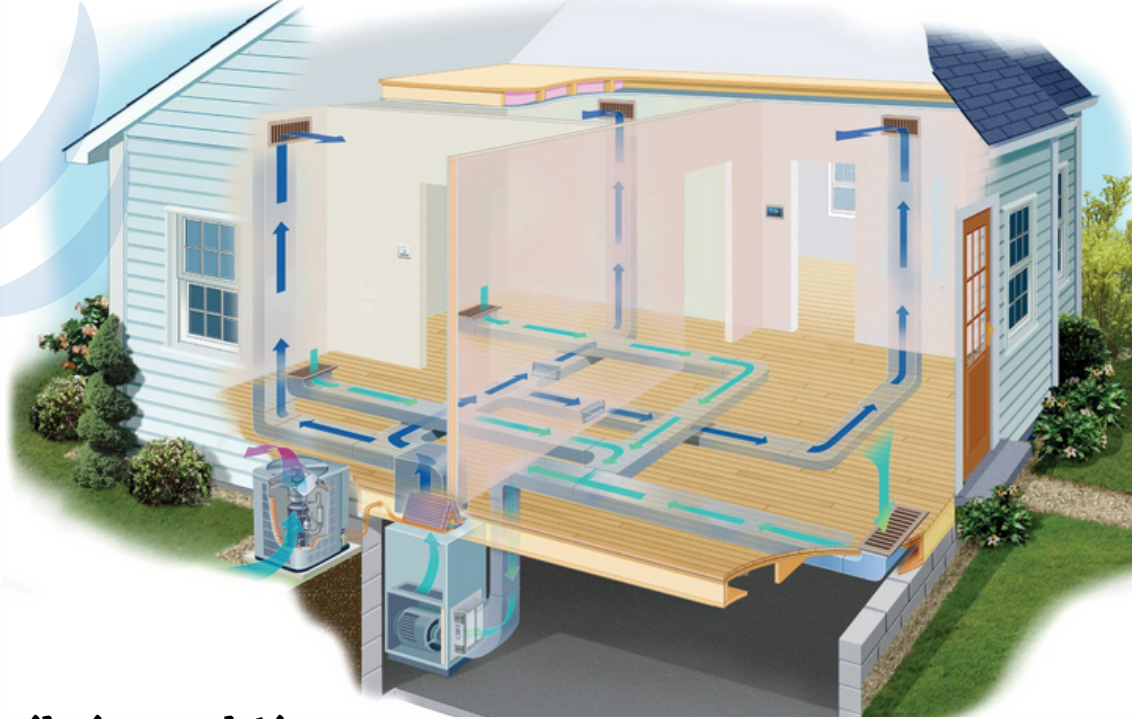
