New Diagnosis

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Less than 3 years:

- early intervention services through Case management Agency in your county
- apply for medicaid waiver based on eligibility
- insurance based therapies
- establish care with pediatric primary caregiver
- developmental pediatrician or child psychiatrist for behavioral medication management and guidance to primary care giver
- other specialists according to diagnoses through Children's Hospital Colorado or Rocky Mountain Children's Hospital

Greater than 3 years:

- -residential school district for enrollment and IEP/504 plan consideration
- apply for medicaid waiver based on eligibility
- insurance based therapies
- establish care with pediatric primary caregiver
- developmental pediatrician or child psychiatrist for behavioral medication management and guidance to primary care giver
- other specialists according to diagnoses through Children's Hospital Colorado or Rocky Mountain Children's Hospital

Pediatric to Adult Transition

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- -start talking to pediatrician before your child turns 18 so you and they have time to prepare for transition
- -ask for list of preferred adult providers who work with individuals with special needs. Ask the same of all specialist providers and therapist providers
- -start looking for day program and vocational programs during high school and even before bridge/transition program if those services are not embedded into your school system
- -work with case manager through CMA to complete all the steps needed to transition to and qualify for adult medicaid waivers
- -ask primary caregiver for guardianship letter and provide them with relevant information they should add as outlined by case manager or legal team

Best practices for working with primary care doctor

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- -yearly physicals (even if specialists handle most of care primary signs bulk of the paperwork)
- -be organized to best of your ability with medication lists, question lists, recent list of specialist visits and updates if possible
- -make sure means of efficient communication(use portal as much as possible providers are too busy to call back!)
- -give heads up with a portal message for new issues and concerns so they can be prepared before appointment
- -alert them of hospitalizations so they can review records from the hospital before follow up appointments
- -get to know MA that works closest with your provider
- -get to know referral coordinator if there is one in the office
- -when letter of medical necessity is requested try to work with case manager with Case Management Agency, Home Health Company attendant or therapist to draft a template so provider knows what information is needed. Same for peer to peers requested for Private Duty Nursing or Certified Nursing Assistant Services

Best practices for working with specialists

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- -request to go on cancellation waitlist or be willing to go to different campus if it reduces wait time
- -be compliant with appointments do not no show if you can avoid it since wait times to get in are so long
- -make sure means of efficient communication(use portal as much as possible providers are too busy to call back!)
- -give heads up with a portal message for new issues and concerns so they can be prepared before appointment
- -alert them of hospitalizations so they can review records from the hospital before follow up appointments i
- -get to know nurse or MA that works closest with your provider
- -when letter of medical necessity is requested try to work with case manager with Case Management Agency, Home Health Company attendant or therapist to draft a template so provider knows what information is needed. Same for peer to peers requested for Private Duty Nursing or Certified Nursing Assistant Services
- -take advantage of complex scheduler through Children's
- if feeling unheard by specialist ask your primary care doctor to make contact and help you advocate for your child
- -if your child is medically complex and you have several specialists involved encourage them to communicate with one another request a care conference if there are diagnostic or treatment dilemmas that necessitate this
