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## Upcoming Meeting Preview: Saturday, April 8th.

We are very excited that painter **Shelby Keefe** will be giving a demonstration of her art techniques at our meeting this Saturday, April 8th.

Shelby's work is inspired by how light affects our world, and is described as "Expressive Realism".

Coming from a family of artists and crafters in rural Wisconsin, she was encouraged to draw and paint and always had plenty of inspiration for making her artwork. After earning her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree in 1981, she embarked upon a career in graphic design. Moving to Milwaukee for school opened a whole new world for her, and she fell in love with the urban landscape.

Though most of her time was spent as a graphic designer and single mother of two boys, she was always passionate about painting, and made time to create her work. By doing group exhibitions, art fairs, and commission work, she gradually gained the attention of enough collectors and was able to retire from graphic design in 2005 to work full-time as a fine artist.

As her reputation grew, she became sought after as an instructor, teaching workshops around the country and serving as faculty for the annual Plein Air Convention and Expo.

A consistent award-winner, Shelby has participated in museum shows, top-tiered plein air painting competitions, and has attained Signature Status in Oil Painters of America, American Impressionist Society, and American Women Artists.

Her unique style has become noticed nationally, having been published in "Southwest Art" and "Plein Air Magazine"--both being honored as the cover artist. She has galleries in the west and her native Midwest.

**The Hardy Gallery** in Ephraim (Door County) is pleased to kick off the 2023 season with its 61st Annual Wall-to-Wall Juried Exhibit, on view May 26 - July 9, 2023. Submissions will take place in person on Friday, May 19 and Saturday, May 20, 10 am – 3 pm at the Hardy Gallery. All entries submitted will be juried to determine five financial awards that total \$1550 and three Honorable Mention awards. Awards include Best in Show (Francis Hardy Legacy Award) (\$500), Second Place Award (\$400), Third Place Award (\$300), the Julia Van Roo Bresnahan Artistic Achievement Award (\$200), and People's Choice Award (\$150). All media is accepted including painting, drawing, sculpture, photography,

ceramics, mixed media, and more. A \$35 non-refundable entry fee is required, artists ages 18 years of age or older are invited to submit one 2-dimensional and one 3-dimensional piece. This year's judge is representational rural landscape painter, Craig Blietz. ## Milwaukee Art Museum Update from member Muaree Childress

Your Milwaukee Art Museum hours are Wednesday, 10am-5pm; Thursday, 10am-8pm; and Friday-Sunday 10am-5pm.

- Visit the MAM to see the new exhibition in the large Baker/Rowland Gallery! <u>Scandinavian Design and the United States</u>, <u>1890-1980</u> shows the extensive design exchanges between the United States and Denmark, Sweden, Finland, Norway, and Iceland. You'll see more than 180 objects, including furniture, textiles, drawings, ceramics, jewelry, glass, and product designs, spanning from the arrival of Nordic immigrants in the late 19th century to the environmental and socially conscious design movements of the 1960s and 1970s. You will even see a gorgeous car! *Scandinavian Design and the United States*, <u>1890–1980</u> is co-organized by the Milwaukee Art Museum and the Los Angeles County Museum of Art in collaboration with the Nationalmuseum Sweden and the Nasjonalmuseet in Norway.
- In the Herzfeld Center for Photography and Media Arts is <u>Native America: In</u> <u>Translation</u>. This fascinating photography exhibition is by and about Native America artists. It is an important and complex collection that exemplifies what photography is capable of as a medium. Ten artists' perspectives are featured in this stunning, do-not-miss exhibition.
