One is to save me work, and another is that when reading the newsletter, I hope that people make a note about an event they would like to attend. I'm also encouraging all members to read the news (so they will have seen your announcement already!) Please contact me if you have a comment or concern regarding this policy.

Nick Schroeder had two ceramic pieces, a sculpture and a wall tile, accepted for the juried exhibition, "Not Your Mother's Quilt" at the Fine Line Creative Arts Center, St. Charles, Illinois. The show runs October 12 – November 15, 2023 with an opening reception from 6 to 8 p.m., Thursday, October 12. He also had a ceramic mug accepted for the "The Clay Cup VI: Vessel, Icon, Canvas". The national, biennial, juried exhibition of functional, design-based, and sculptural ceramic cups will be at the George Caleb Bingham Gallery at the University of Missouri. The show will run from October 30 – November 30.

Julia Pagenkopf has works juried in the following exhibits: two watercolors into the *Create* exhibit at Richeson School of Art and Gallery in Kimberly, Wisconsin (exhibit runs Sept. 29 – Dec. 1st); two pastel paintings juried into the *Water Works* exhibit at Mainstreet Gallery and Art Center in Lake Zurich, Illinois (exhibit runs through the month of October); two pastels juried into the Dakota Art Pastels Third Quarter Online Exhibit. And finally, she has two pastels juried into the current LMA exhibit at the Polish Center, one of which ("Szymborska's Birthday Poppies") won an Honorable Mention. Julia also organized a two-day workshop in October for the Wisconsin Pastel Artists with internationally renowned pastel artist, Dawn Emerson.

Carolyn Simpson, in conjunction with her solo exhibit, "Within Wisconsin," will have an art reception at the Wauwatosa Public Library, Sunday, October 22, 1:30-3:30.

****This date is rescheduled from the original October 12th date. **** There are 34 works, primarily watercolor, that reflect moments hiking on the Ice Age National Scenic Trail. Wisconsin-inspired refreshments will be served. In addition about 75 mini-paintings that are unframed will be available. A freewill cash donation given at the reception to benefit the Ice Age Trail Alliance will be appreciated and matched.

In addition, Carolyn's watercolor painting, "Corn," was juried into Watercolor Wisconsin 2023 at the RAM's Wustum Museum, 2519 Northwestern Avenue, Racine.

The exhibit is from December 13, 2023-April 13, 2024.

Following is the statement from Juror Frank Juarez

Jurying an exhibition is never easy. There are so many factors that go into selecting works for an exhibition. In a similar fashion to looking at an abstract painting, it is subjective. I look for a narrative that can interweave one work to another. The ability to tell a story through color, line, texture, and imagery can build connections between an active participant and the artist. I think to myself, "in what way am I responding to the artwork that I am seeing for the first time? Am I being transported into a different frame of mind? Is the artwork bringing back a memory or past experience?" Our responses will vary, but my goal is to leave a lasting impression of the work being created in our state.




