The best essay of not less than 300 words or more than 500 words on growing shrubs, plants or trees will receive a check at the WSFGC Convention. Hybridizer Award (odd numbered years)	A check for \$100.00 may be presented in odd-numbered years at the WSFGC convention to a Washington State resident for outstanding achievement in hybridization. Recipient may receive the award only once and need not be a garden club member. In the case of a new variety being developed, a statement from the respective Plant Society should be included with the Book of Evidence. <p>Joyce Lounsberry Garden Therapy</p>	<p>This Traveling Award is available annually to a club for the most outstanding work using Active Garden Therapy as an aid in the rehabilitation of physically or mentally challenged individuals, either or both youth and seniors. A Book of Evidence must include a list of materials used, clear photos of the completed work, a description of the Garden Therapy process, and where the therapy took place. See additional definitions in the Therapy Gardens Chairman section of this Directory. The award ribbon will be a peach-colored rosette. <i>Active Therapy – involving physically or mentally challenged persons in garden related activities such as gardening, field trips, study of birds, nature and conservation.</i></p>	<p>Dec 1</p>

<p>Pollinator Conservation (several categories - see WSFGC book)</p>	<p>Awarded for an outstanding comprehensive program for the protection and welfare of Pollinators, such as creating a garden in a public or private space or schools; habitat protection, protection of migratory routes, public education, establishment of pollinator gardens at a school or community site, or other. If qualified, the winning entry may be sent to NGC for entry into conservation award.</p> <p>1. Programs: may be a single program or series of programs on wildflower education for clubs or youth groups.</p> <p>2. Projects: may include plantings at rural highways, urban highways and rest stops, and establishing wildflower gardens, memorial gardens, etc.</p>			
<p>Therapy Gardens</p>	<p>Therapy Gardens use garden-related activities as an aid in the recovery and rehabilitation of physically and/or mentally challenged individuals. They may be homebound persons, nursing home residents or students in special schools. Garden Club members can provide such persons the opportunity to participate in programs of horticulture and related activities such as growing plants, the artistic use of plants and other natural materials, the study of birds, nature and conservation. Honor Club	The honor club award recognizes the club that offers its membership a balance of programs, projects, and activities that support the goals of NGC. Points earned will be divided by the number of members in the club for a proportionate representation of participation. <p>Phyllis Danielson Table Setting</p>	<p>Awarded for the most outstanding table settings in a Table Section of a Small Standard Flower Show or a Standard Flower Show. The show must have a minimum of three classes in the Table Section with any combination of Functional, Exhibition or Petite (Functional and/or Exhibition) table classes with four entries per class. Winners of Blue ribbon exhibits scoring 95 or more are eligible. Awards will be in (1) Functional, (2) Exhibition and (3) Petite (Functional and/or Exhibition) Table Settings.</p>	<p>Feb 1</p>		
<p>Berta Deming Blue Ribbon</p>	<p>May be given to the person with the most blue ribbons earned in Standard Flower Shows. Exhibitor must be a member of WSFGC.
