

WHAT TO PLANT NOW





March Tip

Any

vegetable sown or transplanted out in March will be happier and give better results under a vented cloche kept in place through mid-April or May.

Make sure to prevent heat build-up by venting during the day, especially if it's sunny! Keep the ground moist enough to assist germination.
