#### HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE GENERAL MEETING APRIL 27TH

- After we recited the pledge of allegiance Karen opened the meeting.
  A reminder that our 100th Anniversary Party will not be May 25th. We will have our regular general meeting. The 100th Anniversary Party will be May 24, 2023.
- May's meeting will be potluck with everyone bringing something to share.
- Discussion about garden club members buying plants at the sale. Every- one agreed that the members should put off picking out their plants until later in the morning & that the sale is for the community. If there is something that you desperately "just have to have" whoever brought it probably has extras to share. We have 3 brand new canopies. Much thanks to Debora & Jon for finding them for us.
- Bee Evan introduced visitor Joy Johnson.
- Decisions were made about the Tea & Tour this summer. See pg 5 for more info.
- Karen & several others talked about the importance of serving on the Executive Board. After nominations from the floor we are still in need of a President. This is very important as our club will not be able to move forward without one.
- At the beginning of Tory's Horticulture program she reminded us that ALL MEMBERS are welcome to bring cuttings from their garden. Just provide whatever information you have & she will fill in where needed. It's fun t& informative to see what is growing at the time. Some of the many examples today were an impressive King Kong Coleus grown from a cutting, Apricot Quince, Viburnam Carlisee, Raspberry Mugwort (a moundy plant), Yellow lutea Corydalis, Little BeautyTulip, Bleeding Heart ground cover, Monster BeautyTulip, Ginny G dwarf Rhody, Stolwinjk Gold Alpine Clematis, & a Hornet gold & maroon Tulip that she planted for her daughter's high school graduation party in 1999. There was also a lovely arrangement that included a Gerbera Daisy, Spanish Bluebells, Wallflower (FYI: part of the cabbage family) & lilac. She also showed us a basket put together for the Garden Art Sale that included Pansies & Heuchera (pix on pg 7). Once again, she stressed MULCH! MULCH! MULCH! Bring your buckets for Power Poo Soil Amendment located off 208th from the Auburn-Enumclaw Highway. First drive on right. If you are interested in submitting an entry for any plant show remember that they need the real botanical name of the plant.
- A delicious potluck was enjoyed by all.
- Jim Olson, Master Gardener, gave a very detailed presentation on "Growing Your Groceries". If you need a reason to start a veggie garden he gave us several: Space, Time, Love Variety, Love Fresh, Sustainability/Organic, Love! Love! Love! Delicious Food. Very important to understand our PNW climate. We are zone 7-8 where the average low is 10-20 degrees. We all have microclimates in our garden so pay attention! The recipe for veggie harvest is Site, Soil, Species, Start (when to), Sustain, & Savor. He recommends a Gardening Calendar, a soil test, & a moisture meter. Also consider a soil thermometer. Maximize your sun: 6 or more hours of full sun a day. Your garden should face N-S with the bed at least 3-4' wide & paths wide enough to get a wheelbarrow thru. Accessibility to water a must & he recommends raised beds. If you have a shortage of space plant in containers or go vertical. To till or not to till? NO! This just stirs up weed seeds. Fertilize & compost. Potting soil breaks down so add amendments every couple of years. The plant info label has everything you need to know about planting & caring for your plant. Watering is an art! Slow & low is best. 1" a week. Identify the critters you have. Catch them at it...90% of them are beneficial. Use the least invasive/aggressive method to control them. Observe & define problems with plants. Identify potential problems & solutions. Pesticides are valuable but read & follow ALL directions on pesticides. Savor! Easiest & most enjoyable part of gardening is nurturing & feeding yourselves & others.

#### THINGS YOU CAN DO IN MAY

- Still time to plant summer bloomers. Purchase new geraniums. Start to plant containers later in the month. Be mindful of nighttime temps & be prepared to cover delicate plants. Keep weeding & watching for slugs. Mow your lawn every 5-7 days & allow fine clipping to fall back on the turf to add nutrition. Mother's Day is often the time to put tomatoes in the ground-if overnight temps are over 55 degrees. If you can't wait, protect with insulating covers.
- Support Monarchs...make your garden friendly to these pollinators by planting several kinds of pesticide-free native milkweed (Asclepias) that flower at different times. Avoid tropical milkweek, which is invasive, or milkweed that's been treated with insecticides to be aphid resistant. Go to saveourmonarchs.org to request free seeds.
