Stimulate interest in the growth of plant materials to their peak of perfection.

Give the student an understanding of how and why a plant grows.

Teach soil structure and methods for making the soil more productive.

Provide an understanding of plants' reactions to certain weather conditions and how to modify these conditions to encourage optimal growth regulators and other chemicals used in general horticultural procedures.

Illustrate methods for rapid propagation.

Offer plant identification instruction.

Explore growing techniques for garden plants, vegetables, fruits, houseplants, trees, shrubs, and specialized styles of gardening.

Develop a respect for and appreciation of plans and their roles in our lives and activities.

Gardening Schools provide current information to those interested in horticulture and related topics. The curriculum has been developed by National Garden Clubs, Inc. (NCG) and is customized by the course instructors. Classes are open to the public as well as garden club members. Garden club members who complete the series of four courses (and pass the exams) are awarded the designation of NGC Gardening Consultant.
