### Garden To Do Calendar.....Warm days, cool nights

Prepare your garden for cooler, wetter weather. Aerate & fertilize your lawn early in the fall to help your grass produce healthy root growth. Plant trees & shrubs now too. It's a good time to plant bulbs—but be careful not to put the fertilizer directly in the hole or you might burn the bulbs. Divide peonies & add new varieties to your garden. Stagger out the planting of camellias so you can enjoy them from November to April. Start planting cool-season vegetables, including kale, turnips, mustard, broccoli & cabbage. The warm days & cool nights are ideal for carrots, too. Be sure to add compost if you're planting veggies in the same beds as your summer crops. If frost is in the forecast, harvest your tomatoes (even unpripe ones) so they don't turn to mush due to the chill.
