National Smokey Bear/Woodsy Owl Poster Contest for Youth Grades 1-5 Deadline Dec 15, 2020

Grades First through Fifth grade students are invited to demonstrate their understanding of fire prevention and basic environmental conservation principles through original drawings of Woodsy Owl.

General Poster Rules:

- All poster entrees must be sponsored by a local Garden Club.
- Since this year is Woodsy Owls 50th birthday, the 2020 posters must feature Woodsy Owl only.
- Woodsy Owl posters must be based upon and include Woodsy's conservation message:
 "Lend a Hand Care for the Land!"
- The entry posters should encourage children to take a personal role in preventing wildfires or conserving natural resources.
- Each entry should be 11" x 17" in size.
- Materials that can be used include crayons, markers, poster paints, watercolors, etc.
- No three-dimensional posters, computer scanned, or electronically generated images will be accepted! However may include artwork pasted upon a second piece of paper but must be flat.
- Affix form available from the club President to the back of the poster providing the artist's name, address, home phone number, grade level, school, teacher's name, city, and State. Also on the form provide the name of the sponsoring local Garden Clubs information. Do not use a dark marker for this information as it may show through.
- Garden Clubs must submit their five winning posters (one in each grade 1-5) to their District Chairman no later than December 15.
- The District Chairman must submit the five District winners (one in each grade 1-5) to the State Chairman no later than January 15.
- The State Chairman must submit the five State winners (one in each grade 1-5) to the Pacific Region Chairman no later than February 15.

Poster Tips:

- A good poster is bold and simple in design.
- Its message is delivered in both the picture and the slogan.
- Its message is easily understood.
- Posters are to be completed by individual student artists.
- Competition includes students from 1st to 5th grade.
- Since Woodsy Owl is an official icon protected by law, the clothing colors need to be accurate.
- Students should be reminded to check spelling. Posters with spelling errors will be disqualified.

Posters will be judged 20 percent each for originality, design, slogan, artwork, and overall effectiveness of the message.

The NGC Grand Prize National Poster Contest Winner will win a free round trip airfare and accommodations for four to Washington, D.C. A \$100 U.S. Savings Bond will also be awarded to the First Place National winners from each grade level sponsored by the National Garden Clubs, Inc.
